

During the month of January, 58 patients were admitted to the McCausland Hospital, 245 outpatients were treated, there were 3 newborn, and patient days numbered 338.

The work on the new hospital is progressing well. All the windows are in and all the partition walls are up. Most of the heavy mechanical equipment is already inside the building. Roughing in electrical work, plumbing and ductwork is coming along nicely.

Several years ago, as part of the campaign to raise funds to build a new hospital, a scheme of payroll deduction of contributions was instituted, approved by the various employers in the area and supported generously by many of their employees. We would now appeal to residents of the communities served by The McCausland Hospital to assist in this project by pledging contributions to be deducted from their pay cheques. Contributions in the amount of \$100.00 will entitle the donor to Life Membership in The McCausland Hospital Corporation.

In a future issue of this paper we shall publish a list of equipment necessary to the new hospital building, and would like to challenge individuals and organizations to donate items of their choice.
