

### SUPERIOR HOCKEY SCHOOLS

Under new directorship, sweeping changes are in store for the Lakehead School of Hockey as it heads into its 11th season of summer operation.

Well-known hockey authority Dave Siciliano has taken over the major decision making of Thunder Bay's most popular hockey school. His knowledge of the sport goes without saying. He is one of Canada's most versatile hockey inovators and this fact will be brought forth this summer when he puts his ideas to work to make the 11th year the best ever.

To put his theories to work, coach Siciliano has surrounded himself with a host of talented instructors, some 15 in all. All of these instructors have coached in the Lakehead School of Hockey or other hockey schools and eight are presently coaching various teams in Thunder Bay.

"I've been studying the program conducted the past number of years in the school and feel there is a need for change in a number of areas", stated coach Siciliano. "If feasible, we plan to keep the students on the ice in two hour shifts instead of one hour, eliminating dressing room problems and an extra change. Councillors will be with each group from when they start on the ice and through all field programs, giving the boys a better sense of leadership."

Once again the school will be run at the Port Arthur Arena. The first two-week session begins July 30 and the second August 13. Already a tremendous amount of interest has been shown for the new-look school with applications forms available at all the citys' rinks and arenas as well as sports' stores.

New faces in the school include Mike Hordy, professional with New York Island-ers farm team at Fort Worth. Mike was the winner of the Bob Gassoff most improved defenceman award last season. Sean Donohue, is currently the assistant coach at Lakehead "U" and has taught in two other hockey schools. Trevor Johansen of the Toronto Maple Leafs has joined the staff as full-time instructor and his defensive knowledge will be a great asset. Brian DePiero is re-joining the staff after a couple of years running Thunder Bay Twins hockey school. The current coach of LU is a former coach of the Twins and one of Thunder Bay's better hockey players.

The new staff will join many familiar faces who have gained a strong reputator

as hockey instructors. Dave Fitzpatrick returns for his third season as the goaltender coach. He has been instrumental in helping many local goalies improve their skills at the Superior Christmas Hockey School as well as various power skating schools. Fitzpatrick currently plays for the Thunder Bay Twins, Canadian International Hockey League leaders. Ken Clifton is also returning for his third season as our residence power skating expert. Clifton coached Westgate High School and presently the Rural Voyageurs Junior Hockey team of the Thunder Bay Junior Hockey League.
