Training Your Dog
 We now have a full description on this course which will be held on Saturday, March 12th, from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m. This workshop is designed for the person interested in obedience training for his/her dog. It will include demonstrations, two training periods with participating dogs, and information hand-outs. Step by step procedures will be covered on training your dog to

heal, sit, come when called, etc. Dogs should be at least 6 months old and need not be registered. Equipment required is a 6 foot leash and choke chain. The choke chain must be sufficient length to allow

industrial assessment away from school boards, the next logical step is to take it away from Municipal Councils and we all know the serious trouble both of these towns will be in if they lose the taxes from the mills."

"The ROSE Report is the Response on Secondary Education. Over the last few years the government has been conducting something called the Secondary Education Review Project under Dr. Duncan Green, the Director of the Toronto Board of Education. The SERP Report was finished last year and it made recommendations for changes in the educational system. Changes in Grade 13 among other things. This year we are going to be required to comment on the Ministry of Education's reply to SERP, the ROSE Report. It is going to take a lot of time, energy and require a lot of work on the part of our staff."

News: What do you see as the major difference between the present Board and the former Board of Education? "Oh, the Trustees of this Board are going to be more sensitive to the opinions of the people in the communities who elected them. The old Board had a rough time because they lost touch with their communities. The Trustees of this Board are

going to be very careful. They are going to examine, to dissect and to get to the root of everything that comes before the Board. You are going to see more community oriented Trustees rather than system or global Trustees."

News: How do you feel about the new Board?

"I have been very impressed by the competence of this Board. The members know what they want, and they are determined to get it. Everything I have seen so far indicates that it is going to be a very good Board of Education, and the students, the schools and the communities are going to benefit from it."

News: Is there anything else you would like to sum up with?

"Yes, every town can feel a new confidence in this Board. It is the end of the isolation of some communities. In the past there was a feeling that one or two towns carried more weight than the others. Schreiber for instance felt isolated in the last Board. That's no longer true. Schreiber can feel confident that this Board understands its need to keep secondary education in the community, Marathon and Terrace Bay can feel confident that we are going to fight to keep local control of industrial taxes, Manitouwadge can feel confident that their concerns about housing are going to be properly dealt with."

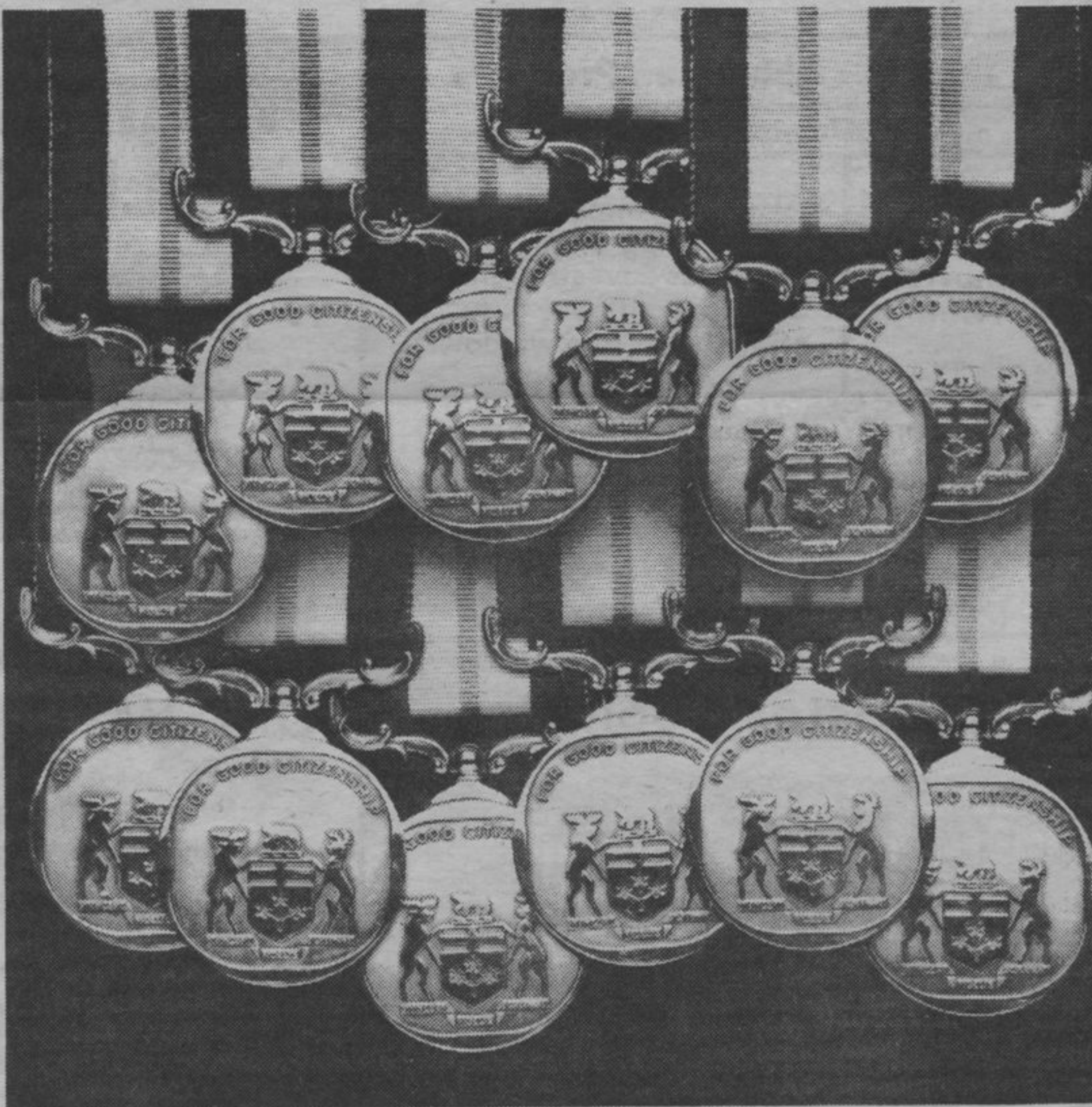
