Literacy problem could slow national change

Does level of schooling of the workforce make any difference? Yes it does, particularly if an organization or nation is planning for, or in midst of any changes.

The word "schooling" is used deliberately here to avoid a problem in assessing education levels. Often "education" is used as a synonym for "schooling." As a result, a person who went to grade 8 in school may be classified as uneducated even though the person

may be a self-directed learner who is broadly and specifically educated as a result of life experience.

Despite the foregoing. generally the level of schooling is an important indicator of reading, writing and computational skills. Unless a person's day-to-day work requires him/her to read, write and do computations regularly, s/he functions at 1/2 his/her grade achievement level.

Today, functional literacy is the ability to read at a grade 10 level. For example, reading levels of sports pages are written at grade 9, editorial pages at university, instructional manuals at grade 12 and 13 levels.

We've been working recently with a company that is planning to improve its effectiveness and viability through learning and chance on the part of many employees.

Overall, about one third of the workforce have completed elementary school, one third have completed high school, 18 per cent have trade qualification and 11 per cent have attended university with 3 per cent holding a degree. But on further

training. If one assumes that most jobs at this company require very little reading as part of their daily routine, two out of three employees will be functioning at or below the functional literacy level. This will limit severely the usefulness of print materials for providing information,

organization is not an isolated incident. There, 36 per cent of the workforce have less than a grade 9 education. In Canada as a whole, 28.4 per cent have less than grade 9 education. That's one in four Canadians!

As Canada switches from an industrial to a post-industrial society, a substantial amount of retraining and new learning is needed. Training for basic literacy is a pressing need.

Are Canadians and our education-providing organizations equal to the challenge?

NOW is the time to pick up your licence renewal sticker. Because of the new system, late-comers may find themselves in longer than usual lineups.

WHAT you need is an application form available at any licence issuing office, proof of insurance, ownership permit and the required fee. Fees are \$2 a month based on your birth month. See table below.

WHERE? You can renew at any licence issuing office in your area. Check the sticker you receive to ensure it correctly reflects your birth month.

YOU are responsible for having a new validation sticker by February 28. The sticker goes on the upper right-hand corner of the rear plate on passenger cars; the upper right-hand corner on the front plate of commercial vehicles. If you sell your vehicle, remove the plates and attach them to your new vehicle.
