Progress Notes: the McCausland Hospital

The McCausland Hospital Board is pleased to announce the arrival of Dr. W.G. Goldthorpe, D.P.H., M.D., C.C.F.P., to the Terrace Bay, Schreiber, Rossport area. Dr. Goldthorpe comes to us from Sioux Lookout and began work on January 24th, 1983. He has a tremendously varied educational background as well as work experiences. Gary graduated from the University of Toronto, School of Medi-

cine in 1961, received his diploma in Public Health from the University of Toronto in 1967 and completed his M.Sc. in Health Administration in 1970.

Dr. Goldthorpe's work experiences have taken him to such places as Pahang Malaysia, Kingston Jamaica, Ghana, Fort George, Quebec, Dalhousie New Brunswick, Toronto, and of course Sioux Lookout, Ontario. As well as practicing medicine Dr.

Goldthorpe has participated in numerous government healthrelated studies, as well as being an Assistant Professor at two Ontario Medical Schools.

The citizens of our communities, we are sure, will join the Board of Governors in welcoming Dr. Goldthorpe to our area. Gary will remain with us until mid May, 1983, when Dr. R. Mainman will return to practice medicine on May 1st, 1983.

With the departure of Dr. G.B. Croll to Thunder Bay and the voluntary retirement of Dr. A.B. Adey effective January 31st, 1983 from the Active Medical Staff, the complement of Active Medical Staff members practising family medicine at The McCausland Hospital will be two. the approved Board Policy that there be a minimum of three family practitioners on the Active Medical Staff of the McCausland Hos-

A further word about the Ontario Government's Underserviced Area Programme: The main objective of this programme is to assist Northern communities to attract two full-time permanent physicians. It provides locum tenens or "part-time" physicians on a short term basis only, to ensure communities have adequate medical staff until permament physicians can be attracted.

The Board of Governors would like to reassure the citizens it serves that the Board is aggressively searching for two permanent physicians; however, as most citizens can appreciate, the lead time in attracting physicians to the North can be considerable. With the excellent health care facilities at The McCausland Hospital, the Board feels it can achieve its objective by the Fall.


