MOOSE MILK

MOOSE MILK

- 1 pint milk
- 1 pint cream
- 2 ounces rum
- 1 pint rye
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 6 eggs
- nutmeg

Beat eggs till whites and yolks are thoroughly blended. Add the milk, cream, vanilla, rye and rum, mix well.

Place in fridge till chilled. Pour into glasses and sprinkle with nutmeg, before serving. The above recipe makes two quarts of Moose Milk!

- 1/4 cup margarine
- 1 cup boiling water
