Modernization Program to \$276 million from-\$235 million. These DREE grants, along with provincial grants, are expected to generate between \$3 and \$4 billion in private sector investment in pulp and paper modernization.

Under this program, the Government of Canada invested \$100 million in northern Ontario. Those DREE grants have generated more than \$1 billion in private sector investments. The result is that northern Ontario possesses one of the most modern pulp and paper industries in the world. **New Direction**

Canada's usable forest stocks are decreasing. Reforestation and forest management are vital in maintaining the forest industry and in generating growth.

The Government of Canada is negotiating new forestry agreements with the provinces. The aim of the federal government, in negotiations, is to increase timber stocks and improve forest management.

The federal government, through job creation programs, is helping to combat the present problem of unemployment while regenerating timber stocks to meet the future needs of the forest industry.

By many economic standards, the forest industry is perhaps Canada's most important industry. The Government of Canada has taken and will continue to take action to enhance the forest sector and its benefits for all Canadians.
