Terrace Bay Council supports parking for handicapped

The Terrace Bay Council has decided to take action to make it easier for handicapped people to get around town.

Rod Thompson appeared before the Council at its regular meeting on Monday, February 28 and spoke on the need for facilities for the handicapped. Thompson suggested that special parking be created at the Recreation Centre and on Simcoe Plaza and that additional light-

ing be put in place on the northeast corner of the Arena. In addition he suggested that increased attention be given to the removal of ice and snow in the area along the sidewalk between the Recreation Centre and the Swimming Pool.

Responding to Mr.

Responding to Mr. Thompson Reeve Dave Speer said, "I have to agree with you Rod that there is a problem and it is one that has been overlooked for too long.

I have raised your point about parking with the Chief of Police. We have already received a memo from the Minister of Transportation and Communications, the Hon. James Snow, strongly recommending the adoption of By-laws establishing special parking spots for the handicapped. The Chief will be preparing draft by-laws for us. I want to thank you Rod, and we will get the parking bylaws underway tomorrow.'

Mr. Thompson replied that, "I'm sure some people will be upset if you take two spaces in a heavily used parking area." Councillor Ollie Chapman said that she recognized that it might not be a universally popular move but said, "I see no reason why there couldn't be two parking spots put there for the handicapped." Councillor George Ramsay agreed and
