

Rosspport break and enters go to court

Schreiber OPP have been carrying out an investigation of a series of break and enters in the Schreiber and Rosspport area. There have been about a dozen such incidents over the last eighteen months and the

investigations resulted in the laying of a number of charges.

Prosecution of those charges began last week in Provincial Offenses Court, Criminal Division in Schreiber.

Five young men from

Rosspport appeared in Court to answer to the charges. Dennis Goodchild pled guilty to a charge of breaking and entering Andre Nicol's camp on Nicol Island off Rosspport, stealing a chainsaw, stripping it of

parts and later burying the chassis of the chainsaw in the bush.

Crown Prosecutor Leon Nicol said that it appeared that Goodchild had fallen into bad company and had no previous record. Nicol recommended leniency. Judge Roy Mitchell agreed and found Goodchild guilty but deferred sentencing for 14 months, ordered restitution of the value of the chainsaw and 14 months probation.

Charges against Darin Gerow, Darcy Bain, Paul Auger, and Narcisse Bain were remanded until the next Court on April 6.

On the Terrace Bay docket, Gordon Caldwell pled guilty to a charge of Impaired Driving. He was fined \$300 or 21 days.

Aldofo Collini was remanded to April 6 on a charge of Impaired Driving and refusing to take a breathalyser test.

Cosimo Costa was charged under the Criminal Code with Theft under \$200. He was given a conditional discharge and probation for seven months and ordered to make restitution to the value of \$169 and 16 hours Community Service Work.

Richard Dale Evoy was found guilty of possession under section 31 of the Narcotics Control Act and fined \$400 or 30 days. Evoy was also found guilty of Breach of Probation under section 661 of the Criminal Code and fined \$300 or 30 days.

James Malcolm Ferguson was found guilty of impaired driving and
