

Building permits . . .

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Works Treatment plant are expected to be let before the middle of April.

The Council also decided to act to enforce the sewage control by-law. A local business will be informed by letter "that an inspection will be made to confirm that adequate steps have been taken to eliminate ground water and surface run off drainage to the sanitary sewer system." The business will be notified that "failing satisfactory proof that the problem has been rectified a charge will be laid."

The Council decided to grant an extension to a local property owner of the time limit for the demolition of a building on his property.

The procedures and inspections governing Building Permits are to be tightened up. The decided that "greater control is to be taken on those building permits applications that are not meeting the code, or zoning by-law requirements. All building commenced in anticipation of the issuance of a building permit must not be allowed to continue."

The Recreation Committee reported that, "The official capacity of the arena has been set at 807, providing that the big exit doors have their mullions removed."

The perennial problems with leaks in the roof also came up for discussion. "The Committee is concerned with the leaking roof, and the

fact that it the roof repair is done piecemeal, no warranty for the roof repair work done is likely to be forthcoming. Further investigation will be made in that regard."

A by-law establishing a fine of \$35.00 for having a vehicle impeding snow removal and requiring towing was passed on a motion by Mike Cosgrove, seconded by Ed Borutski. Vehicles impeding snow removal will be towed and impounded on township property and the owners may recover them by paying the fine.

The Council considered a draft of the 1983 cemetery budget. "The Township plans to prepare a map and directory of the cemetery, and also plans to hire students for the work this summer. A reserve is to be established for the construction of a vault."

"The final draft of the R-271 (Cook's Lake) Subdivision, has been received, and subject to Council's final approval, will go to the Ministry of Housing for approval. The new subdivision will contain 49 lots."

Under correspondence, a local business wrote to the Council

"concerning the excessive pile up of snow around their buildings and requesting that the Township remove snow from the area as a matter of policy. The Clerk was instructed to reply stating, that it is the policy of the present Council to remove snow from the area, when the accumulation of snow becomes a safety hazard, and to request that (the business) co-operate in this respect to insure traffic safety."

The Ministry of Transportation and Communications wrote to the Council to find out if the Council wished its Zone painting crew (highway lines) to do any work in the Township. The Council replied that it will be

using the Zone painting crew and agreed to "accept all cost of repainting traffic and zone lines."

The Council passed a motion requesting an economic development seminar in Schreiber. The motion was moved by Councillor Larry Dunwoody and seconded by Councillor Mike Cosgrove. "Whereas the Council of the Township of Schreiber is committed to the development of the community, therefore be it resolved that the Township of Schreiber request the Municipal Advisory Committee to conduct an Economic Development Seminar in Schreiber."

General accounts in the amount of \$34,079.89 and Water Works Accounts in the

amount of \$31,743.27 were approved.

The Township has received title to Lot 2, Plan 826, Brunswick Street in default of taxes. The Council decided to put to property up for tender and to put a reserve bid on it of \$7,500.

A request for the purchase of a commercial lot on the old arena site was received. "The matter was referred to the Property Committee for further study and consideration."

"A request for the purchase of a residential lot on Park Street was reviewed. Council reiterated its position, that the lots in the Lakeview subdivision are to be sold individually and not as parcels of two. The current price for lot 862 Park Street is \$11,000, lots 64 and 65 have a price of \$9250 each."

The Council meeting adjourned on a motion by Councillor Larry Dunwoody seconded by Councillor Ed Borutski.

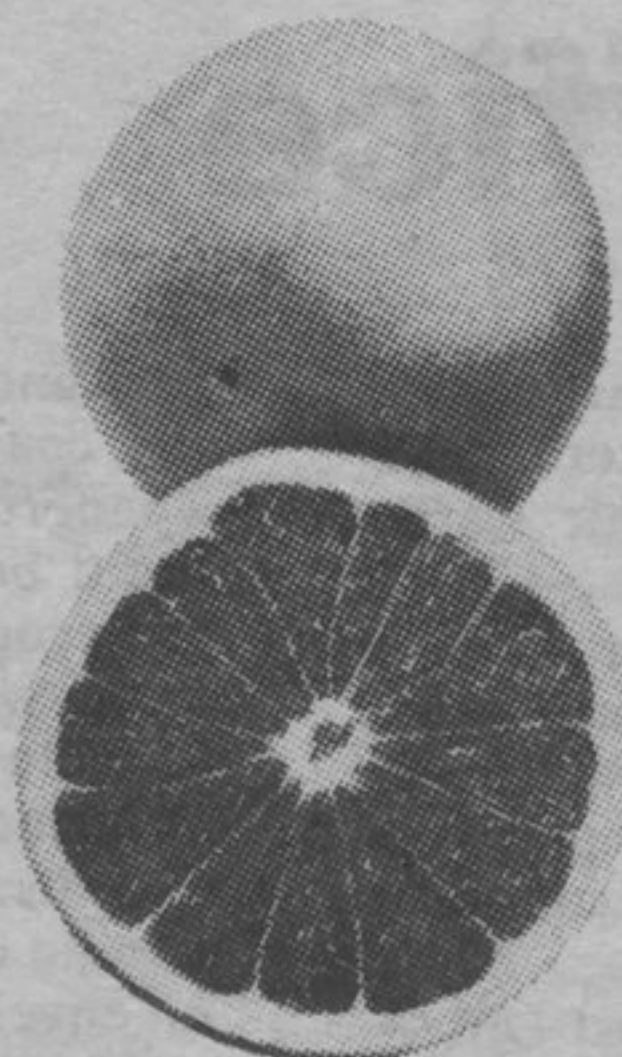
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
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
