

Society meets

The annual North-western Ontario Professional Recreation Society conference was held in Thunder Bay on April 10, 11, 12 and 13. Approximately 30 people attended, representing various communities of Northwestern Ontario such as: Longlac, Geraldton, Terrace Bay, Schreiber, Red Rock, Thunder Bay, Dryden, Kenora, Manitowadge, Sioux Lookout, Ignace and Minaki. The aims and objectives of the society are: 1) to promote the development of positive leisure time pursuits in Northwestern Ontario; 2) To encourage the opportunities for the exchange of knowledge and experience among the members; 3) to provide opportunities for members to gain new information through formal training seminars; 4) to remain continually aware of the need for change and growth and to be prepared to alter the function of this association to meet new needs and challenges.

The history of N.W.O.P.R.S. stems back to the early 50's when the Recreation Directors would meet and discuss matters around regional sporting events and training programs for playground leaders. In later years projects expanded to include professional development courses for members and direct lia-

son with provincial and government agencies. The original name of the association was Northwestern Ontario Directors of Recreation Association. In 1976 the name of the organization was changed to Northwestern Ontario Professional Recreation Society to broaden its membership potential as well as to service the entire recreation profession. Membership in the association is open to any person who is employed in the recreation or education field.

The Recreation Leadership class of Confederation College participated in the conference and their assistance in arranging and participating in the professional development section of the conference was greatly appreciated. 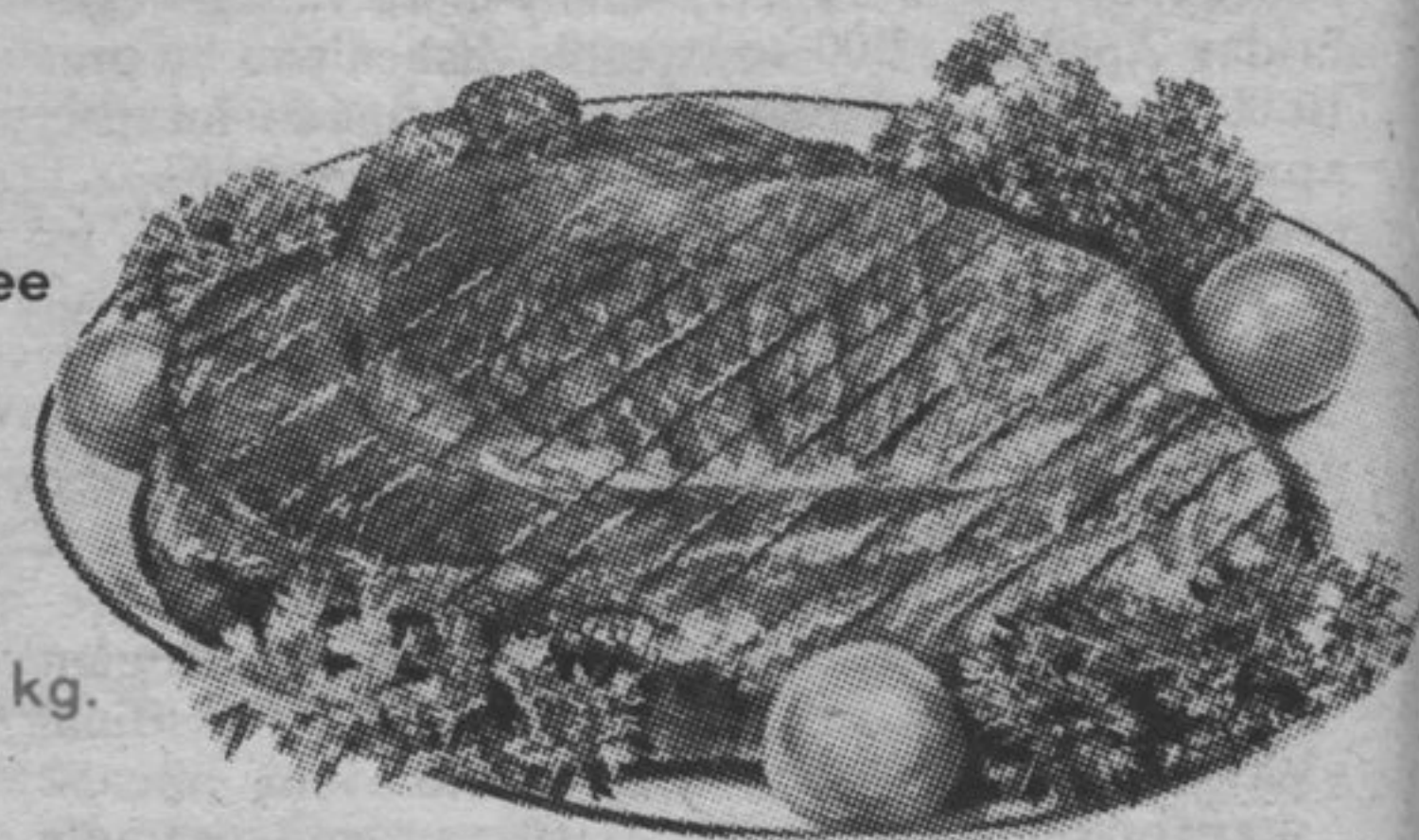
