## Ross appointed to LPH

McCausland Hospital Administrator Don Ross has been appointed by the Ontario Minister of Health to the new Community Advisory Board. The purpose of the Community Advisory Board is to develop and maintain effective avenues of communication between the Lakehead Psychiatric Hospital and the communities it serves. The Board will also assist in promoting community awareness and

understanding of mental health issues and the role of the Lakehead Psychiatric Hospital as well as providing a forum in which communities can affect the management of the hospital in order to best meet local needs for psychiatric.

Ross will be one of the twelve members of the new board which provides broad representation from all of North-

western Ontario. The board is one of seven being set up across Ontario in conjunction with psychiatric hospitals. The members of the Community Advisory Board for the Lakehead Psychiatric Hospital were appointed by the Minister of Health after receiving nominations from the Thunder Bay District Health Council and the Kenora / Rainy River District Health Council.

## Men's Slow Pitch league
