last six months we have had four requests for light commercial land and those requests completely exhaust the land available."

#### Correspondence

Transport Canada sent a letter to the Council denying the Council's request for an extension of the hours worked by the present weather reporting station. The letter said,

"Your request is acknowledged by cannot be supported at this time." Transport Canada said that it would require a more complete statistical record of the volume of airport traffic and the airport and added "We are at present awaiting development of new automatic equipment now in the research stage." Ollie Chapman said, "A question on this beer garden. Not on this one, but on all of them in general. It's about young children being allowed in them.

It's not the place for them. I think it should be stressed that the rules will be strictly enforced regarding minors." Dave Speer said, "I agree. We did have a problem with one here next to the Municipal Offices, but they have been cleaning it up recently. I don't think there would be any problem with this group." The Council passed a motion approving of the beer garden.

Gabe Fritzin wrote to the Council to say that he had been in correspondence with the government of Taiwan about the possibility of twinning a town in Taiwan with Terrace Bay. The letter pointed out that Taiwan in Chinese means Terrace Bay. The Council was quite receptive to the suggest-

ion. Reeve Speer said, "I think we should thank him for his interest."

#### Committee Reports

Councillor Chapman reported for the Recreation Committee. She said, "Everything is going well. The Spring and summer programming is well under way. We intend to use the Arena more extensively this summer than it has been used in previous years."

Councillor Houston said, "Joe, there a few pot holes around town." Public Works Chairman Joe Kennedy replied, "They are already being done." Houston went on to say, "I am going to call a Personnel Committee meeting after this meeting to deal with the replacement of the Clerk-Treasurer."

Councillor Joe Ken-

nedy reported, "Our new power mower arrived today, and we are proceeding with the erection of the new light standard at the Recreation Centre. On Southridge Crescent the citizens are complaining about the piles of earth down there. The boys on the motor bikes run up and down there all night. What we want to do is to haul some black earth in there and seed the area."

Kennedy went on to say, "I have gone to the Legion and set aside Thursday the 23rd for Senior Citizens' Celebrations. We will have some light music, drinks, and I'm going to approach the Legion ladies to put on a light lunch. I want to hire a small band or some sort and a bartender." The Council agreed to authorize the necessary expenditures for Senior Citizens' Week.

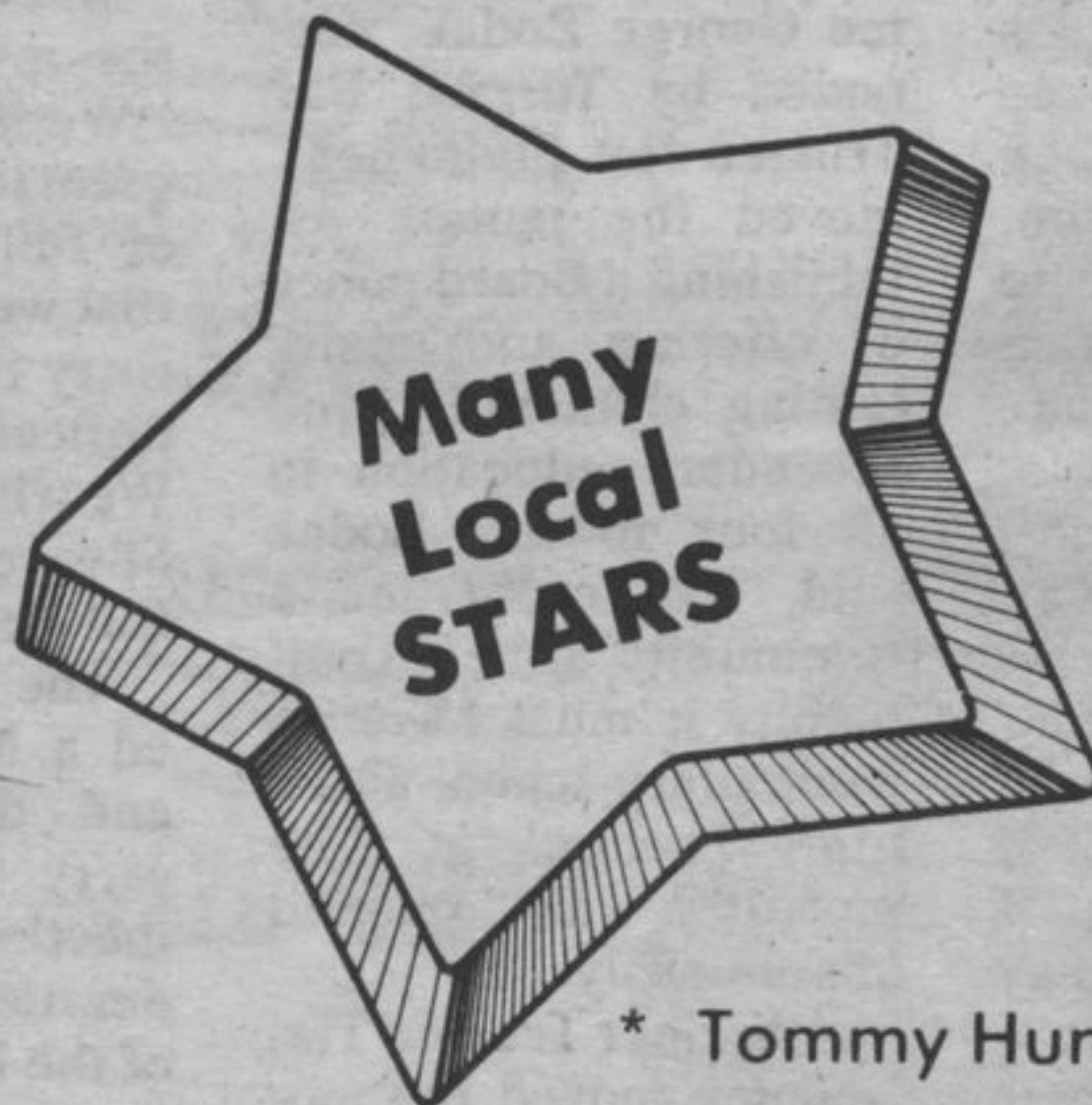
