Canada Hospital Day at McCausland

This year, the McCausland Hospital is observing Canada Hospital Day on Sunday, May 14th, from 2:00 to 4:30 p.m. Highlights of the Day will be demonstrations in physiotherapy and ultra-sound equipment which has just recently been acquired at the hospital. Tours of the hospital will again be available and will be conducted by members of the Board of Governors. Members of the hospital staff will be on hand to answer any questions which come to mind.

This is an opportunity for newcomers to the area and those interested in seeing first-hand the progress made, to visit the hospital and learn what services it is prepared to provide. There will be a blood pressure clinic for those wishing to have their blood pressure checked or who have questions about high blood

pressure and a land ambulance will be on the grounds for your inspection. Medical films will be shown in the public meeting rooms on a continuous basis, so don't hesitate to drop in on the afternoon of Sunday, May 15th. You will find it well worth-while.

A further word about Ultra-Sound: This equipment will check all pregnancies between 15-20 weeks and at the 7th month. The early ones give the age of the fetus and condition and position of the placenta. At the 7th month sound-ing, the scan will indicate the heart beat and number of fetuses. Ultra-Sound is also used to detect cysts or tumors, the gall bladder, kidneys, pancreas, spleen and liver. Ms. Sylvia

McCullough has had an intensive practical course on this equipment at London Victoria Hospital and is fully capable of operating the machine. She reports that she has been kept very busy preparing ultra-sound scans.

And yet another service is being provided to patients. Upon entering the hospital, each patient will be given a card on which the patient may indicate his/her wishes with regard to visitations from the clergy. This is not a compulsory requirement but merely an attempt to learn whether or not the patient would like to have his/her priest or minister pay a visit. There will be a quiet room for the use of the clergy. It is hoped that this Pastoral Care

program will assist the patient in stating his/her preference. These cards will be kept at the nurses station and the patient's request will be carried out by the nursing staff, eg. notifying clergy when requested.

Due to promotion within the company, it is with deep regret that we are losing Dick and Elaine Mannisto. They both have devoted much time and effort to the hospital and have carried out their duties on the Board of Governors to the utmost. We wish them well in their future endeavours - but they will be sorely missed.

The annual meeting of the McCausland Hospital Corporation will be held on Tuesday, June 14th, at 8:00 p.m. in the multi-purpose room.

Anyone wishing to serve on the Board of Governors is invited to submit an application, which may be addressed to the Administration Office at the hospital.

Annual memberships at a cost of \$5 and life memberships costing \$100 are available also at the Hospital Administration Office. We also mention that nominations from the floor will be accepted the night of the meeting, which we repeat is Tuesday, June 14th, at 8:00 p.m.
