The May meeting of the Board of Management of the District of Thunder Bay Homes for the Aged was held at Birchwood Terrace in Terrace Bay on Friday, May 13th with five Board members in attendance.

The Board decided to delay the election of officials as two appointees have yet to be made. They felt this would be finalized by the June meeting.

Accounts for the months of March and April were approved totalling \$387,820.30. Six resident applications were approved for admission, four for Pinewood Court and two for Birchwood Terrace. The tender of Bay Northern Construction for the renovations at Birchwood Terrace for \$29,000.00 was approved. The Board accepted the proposal of Mapledoram Brokers Limited for the four insurance policies covering Pinewood Court and Birchwood Terrace.

The Board approved the amended salary schedule at Pinewood Court and Birchwood Terrace for office employees and craft teachers in order to comply with provincial legislation. The Board agreed to extend the present agreement with C.U.P.E. with the five per cent increase for employees on June 1, 1983. Employees receiving less than \$15,000 will receive a \$750 increase.

The Board approved the tender of Bruno's Contracting to pave a small area of Pinewood Court for wheelchair access to the picnic shelter at a cost of \$350.

The Administrator, M.J. Vibert, was authorized to obtain proposals and tenders on the following work:

Pinewood Court

1. Picnic shelter
2. Change in wall between dining rooms
3. Drapes for main lounge
4. Pre-planning for west wing, prior to dining room addition

Birchwood Terrace

1. Proposal for drapes in main lounge

The Board authorized the Administrator, the Accounts Supervisor, and a Board member to attend the Comprehensive Audit Workshop in Sault Ste. Marie on May 26, 1983 at a cost of \$10.00 per participant.

The Board approved delegates to attend the Annual Regional Conference in Fort Frances on June 8, 9, 10.

The Board spent considerable time with the next item on the agenda, replacement of the Ad-

ministrator. They reviewed a number of options which they had. The final decision was left for the June meeting. The Board's main concern was that the

new appointee would be given sufficient guidance by the present administrator, until the appointee gains some confidence in handling the operation.

Looking back

What was happening in the NEWS twelve years ago May 26, 1971.

Just over 200 people took advantage of perfect weather Saturday to enter a Walk A Thon sponsored by the Grade eight class of St. Martin's school in Terrace Bay.

The twenty mile route between St. Martin's and Holy Angels School in Schreiber was scattered with adults and children of all sizes between 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. when the last walker finally checked in. 204 walkers were registered at the start. 182 made it at least as far as Schreiber. 105 started out on the return trip and 89 completed the entire 20 mile trek.

The first walker to complete the distance was Gerard Pineault, grade 8, who finished in just under 5 hours. Second was Edward Angus and third was Michael Fournier, grade 6.
