High tech in NVO

Telemedicine / Telehealth: The hospitals in NWO have submitted a proposal to the Ministry of Health for an Interactive Audio and Visual Telehealth Network linking all the hospitals in the region. The main goal of the network is to provide easy access for health care providers and patients alike to education and diagnostic facilities nor-

mally found in larger hospital centres. The network will eventually link hospitals to the east and west with the hospitals in Thunder Bay as well as the region with medical centres in Southern Ontario.

The Con College Tech. Outreach: "Outreach" is Confederation College's distance education program consisting of organized, supported, evaluated, learning outside the traditional classroom, usually without the instructor physically present, but with other formalized contact with the college. Every participating community has a Learning Centre established for the duration of the course where each student can use the resource materials provid-

ed at a personally convenient time.

Students receive a study guide containing specific directions for completing their studies along with specific reference for finding the answers. A recommended weekly study assignment is provided. Students complete the work on their own time and schedule. Textbooks and a supplementary reading booklet are usually included to provide information useful for study.

Depending on the course, other materials such as audio or video tapes, required hardware, and a small resource library are provided in the learning centre. Regularly scheduled group meetings are held where students ac-

complish group learning tasks such as discussion topics or specific skill development and problem solving related to the week's assignment.

Following the peer group meeting, the students, using teleconferencing equipment, hold a telephone discussion with the instructor to discuss course content. Learners, once they have adjusted to this method of distance education, find it extremely rewarding and enjoyable and tend to perform better on examinations and tests than traditional classroom students. Currently, courses are available in such areas as Ambulance and Emergency Care, Industrial Hydraulics, Band Management and Early Childhood Education.
