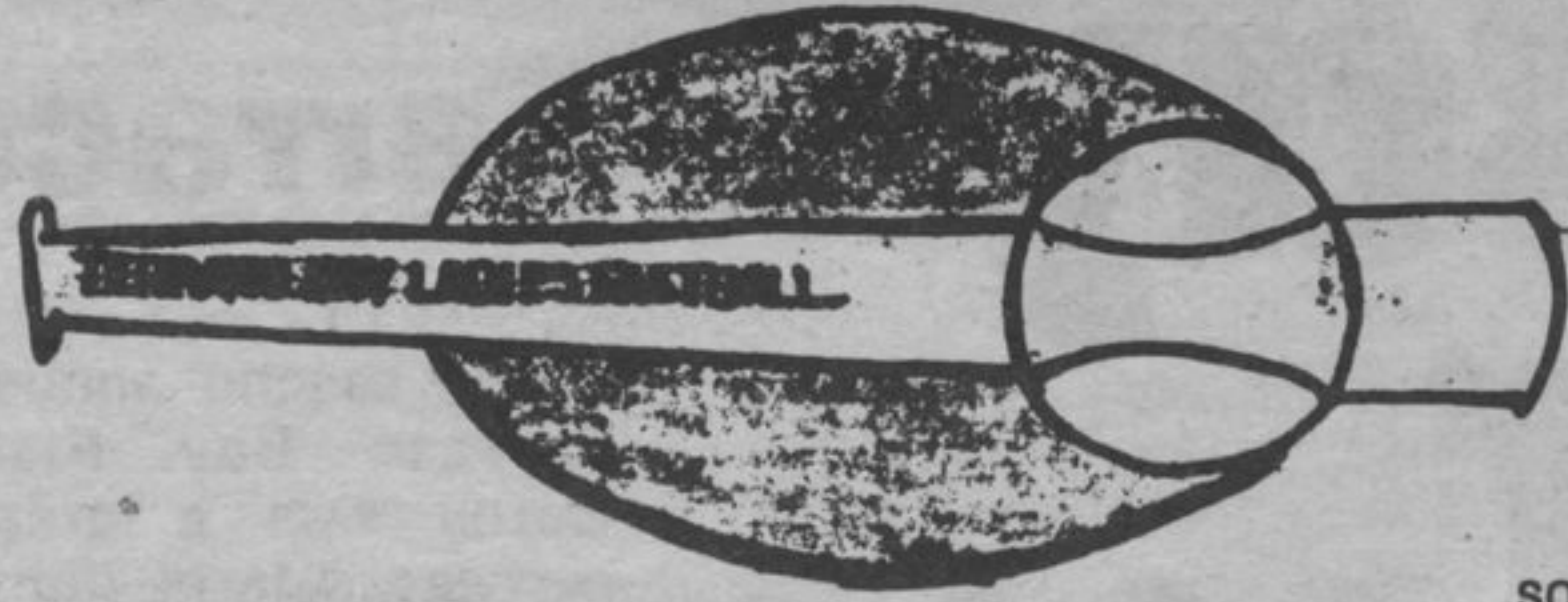


Balls and Bats
