\$2 million marine facilities "fast tracked"

The federal Ministry of the Environment will provide close to \$2 million to accelerate the development of marine facilities in Pukaskwa National Park, On-

tario.

Under the \$2.4 billion Special Recovery Projects Program, the federal government is undertaking and bringing to a rapid completion over one

hundred priority capital projects. The work at Pukaskwa is included in a major component of the program which provides \$220 million for construction over the next four

years of works and facilities in support of land and tourism development.

Pukaskwa is a wilderness park protecting 80 km of unspoiled Lake Superior

coastline. Access by road is limited to the northwest corner of the park and the rest of the park can only be explored on foot or by boat. Marine facilities are essential if

visitors are to appreciate the park's remote, rugged beauty.

The proposed development will include a boat launch, docks and parking lot for public use. There will also be a docking area where equipment and supplies needed in the park's interior can be loaded on boats or barges. Eventually, the marine facility will be the starting point for boat tours.

Construction of the marine facility will be completed by 1985 and will provide about 50 jobs.

Mr. Penner said the Special Recovery Projects Program is de-

signed to contribute to economic recovery and employment during the next two to four years while putting in place key facilities, such as the marina complex at Pukaskwa, that will provide major public benefits over the

longer-term.

Pukaskwa National Park will open this July. Ontario's fourth and largest national park is located on the north shore of Lake Superior, midway between Thunder Bay and Sault Ste. Marie. The park entrance is a 15-minute drive from the Trans-Canada highway, via highway
