The Committee recommended to the Council that the 1969 3 ton truck be replaced with a new 5 ton vehicle. The Ministry of Transportation and Communications will be requested to inspect the 5 ton snow plow truck to help determine if another 3 or 4 years of service are available from it.

Phillips went on to report that the Ministry's line painting crews would be in town on

June 20, and that the paving grant from the provincial government was turned down for this year. Reeve Fischer said, "That's a good report. It's the kind of work that removes a lot of headaches from the Council table." Councillor Phillips replied, "Well, we're learning." The Reeve asked the Council's permission to suspend the Agenda to allow a local resident who had just arrived to speak to the Council. The resident had earlier contacted the Council and had requested the privilege of attending the meeting as a delegation.

### COMPLAINT

The local resident "was on hand to complain about the sewer connection charge assessed for the installation of a lateral to his building on Kingsway. After some discussion, it appeared that "the resident, was in fact concerned about his ability to construct a dwelling on his property, contrary to the provisions of the Zoning by-law. He was advised by Council to submit his application for a minor variance from the Committee of Adjustment. He indicat-

ed that we would present his cheque for the outstanding account at his earliest convenience."

The Water and Sewer Committee reported that "the water treatment plant has been tendered, bids are to be received up to June 30. The matter of infiltration of ground water into the sanitary sewer system was once again discussed, the matter to be taken up with the owners of the Villa Bianca." The building Committee reported that 30 building permits have been issued with a value of \$118,372.

Under Correspondence, the Council received a letter from the North of Superior R.C.S.S. Board advising that Mrs. Cora Dunwoody has been appointed to the Library Study Committee. The Council appointed Councillor Mike Cosgrove as its representative on the Committee.

General accounts in the amount of \$19,796.38, and Water Works accounts of \$8,766.20 were approved.

### HOSPITAL

"Reeve Fischer outlined a plan proposed to

the Council by the McCausland Hospital Board in which the Townships of Schreiber and Terrace Bay, along with the Hospital Board, would co-operate to prepare a promotional package aimed at recruitment of physicians to the Terrace Bay-Schreiber area. The plan is expected to cost each of the participating bodies about \$1500.

The Council agreed to participate in the program on a motion moved by Larry Dunwoody and seconded by Mike Cosgrove.

### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

The Council discussed the question of economic development and decided to advertise "for a six member Economic Development Board." The Council will request "long term commitment on the part of those volunteering to act on the Committee. At a later date the Council will consider sub-committee(s) to investigate those areas of concern that the Economic Development deems necessary and helpful."

The meeting adjourned at 9:45 p.m.
