July 1st Celebrations

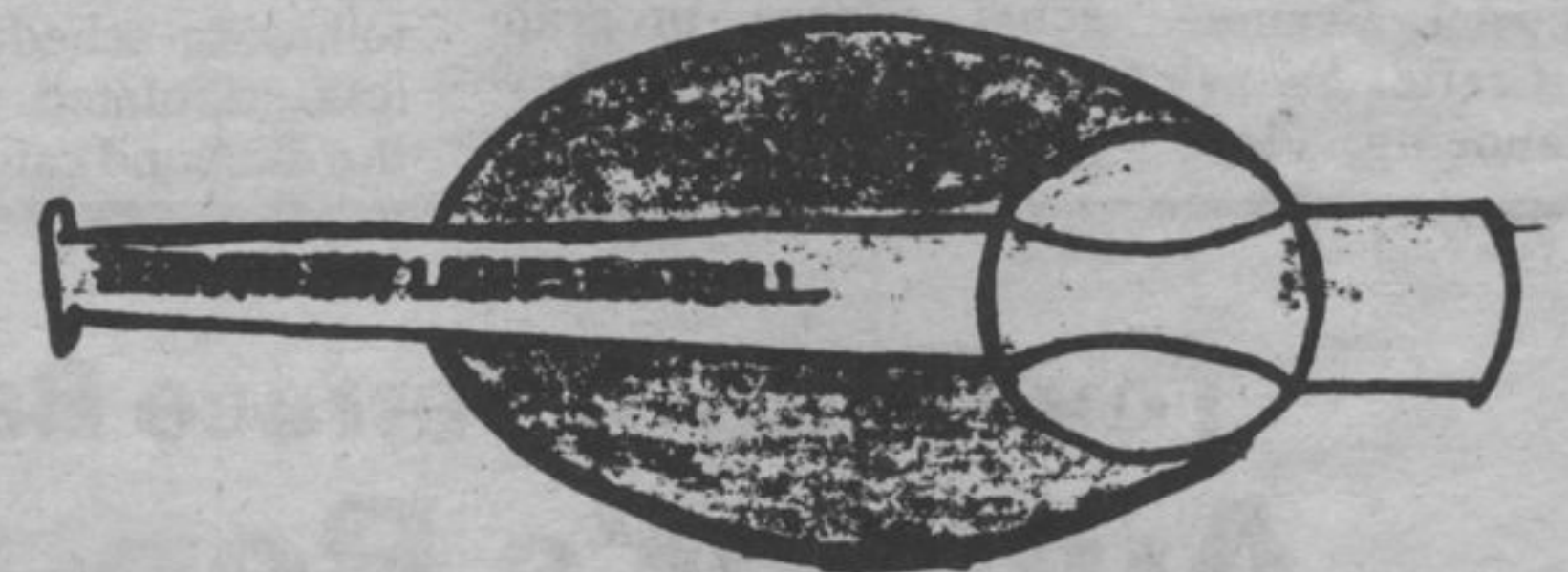
Terrace Bay Kinsmen Soap Box Derby:
