Pineapple - Corn
Muffins

About 15 muffins
1 cup whole wheat flour
1/2 cup soy flour
3 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. salt
1 cup yellow cornmeal
8 1/2 tsp. instant nonfat
dry milk
2 eggs, beaten
1 cup water (or part
water and part liquid
from pineapple)
1/4 cup melted butter (or
margarine

2 tbsp. honey
8 ounces crushed Pineapple (unsweetened) drained. Pineapple preserves (or orange marmalade).

Stir together all the dry ingredients, including the dry milk. Combine all the remaining ingredients (except preserves) and stir into dry ingredients. Don't overmix. Fill oiled muffin cups about 2/3's full and top with 1/4 to 1/2 tsp. of pineapple pre-

serves. Bake at 400 degrees farenheit for about 20 minutes, or till golden. Since these muffins are not very sweet they can be served with the main course. For a dessert muffin you might wish to add more honey.

CLEANING TIP

Use Club Soda to wipe your stainless steel counter, range and hood top. It dries to a gleam without streaks or spots!

Memorial plaque for Tom McGrath

The Sault Ste. Marie based Voyageur Trail Association will be erecting a bronze plaque on Mount Gwyn in memory of Tom McGrath. McGrath was instrumental in the building of the hiking trail between Terrace Bay and Rossport now known as the Casque Isles trail. He was tragically killed in an automobile accident.

Association said, "A bronze plaque will be placed at the top of Mount Gwyn on the Casque Isles Section of the Voyageur Trail to commemorate Tom McGrath who was the inspiration behind that section and club. This decision was made unanimously by the Voyageur Trail Association Board."
