cides with an announcement in the legislature by Northern Affairs Minister Leo Bernier of a new "Community Economic Development Program.'

Bernier told the Legislature, "The program we are introducing today is one more step in this process of helping northern communities to help themselves. Specifically, it will focus on providing assistance to communities for researching, planning and organizing local economic development initiatives. Our professional staff will help communities become aware of and get in touch with other government agencies providing specific industrial development support programs." 'While we have been

now on an ad hoc basis, these activities will be given priority across the North under the new program. In addition, an appropriate level of funding will be made available to support this thrust. This year, three quarters of a million dollars will be included for the Community Economic Development Program."

The assistance will include the following elements:

 Community awareness programs including economic development seminars;

• Investigation of the community's potential for new economic development;

• The development of promotional materials;

• Where consultants are

employed on approved projects the Ministry will reimburse up to 75 per cent of the costs.

"The Ministry will continue to provide special capital development assistance for projects related to local economic development where funds are not normally available from either the public or the private sector."

Reeve Harold Fischer informed the Council that he would be reviewing the Councillor's current Committee assignments, and that he intended to switch Councillor Larry Dunwoody from his present portfolio as a member of the Recreation Committee and appoint him as the Council's representative on the Economic Development Board.
