Skillet Hawaiian

1-12 oz. can Luncheon meat or 1 1/2 cups fully cooked ham, cut in strips 1/2 cup sliced celery

3/4 cup sliced green pepper 2 tablespoons cooking

1-8 oz. can pineapple chunks (juice pack) 1/3 cup orange marma-

lade 1 tablespoon cornstarch 1 tablespoon soya sauce 1/4 teaspoon ground

ginger 1-3 oz. can Chow Mein Noodles

In 10 inch skillet cook meat strips, celery and green peppers in hot cooking oil 'til vegetables are crisp - tender. Meanwhile, drain the

pineapple, reserving 1/: cup of the juice, the marmalade, corn starch, soya sauce and ginger, blend well. Sti into meat mixture in skillet. Cook and stir 'ti mixture is thickened and bubbly. Stir in the pine apple chunks, cool about 2 minutes more o 'til heated through, stir ring occasionally. Serve over Chow Mei Noodles.
