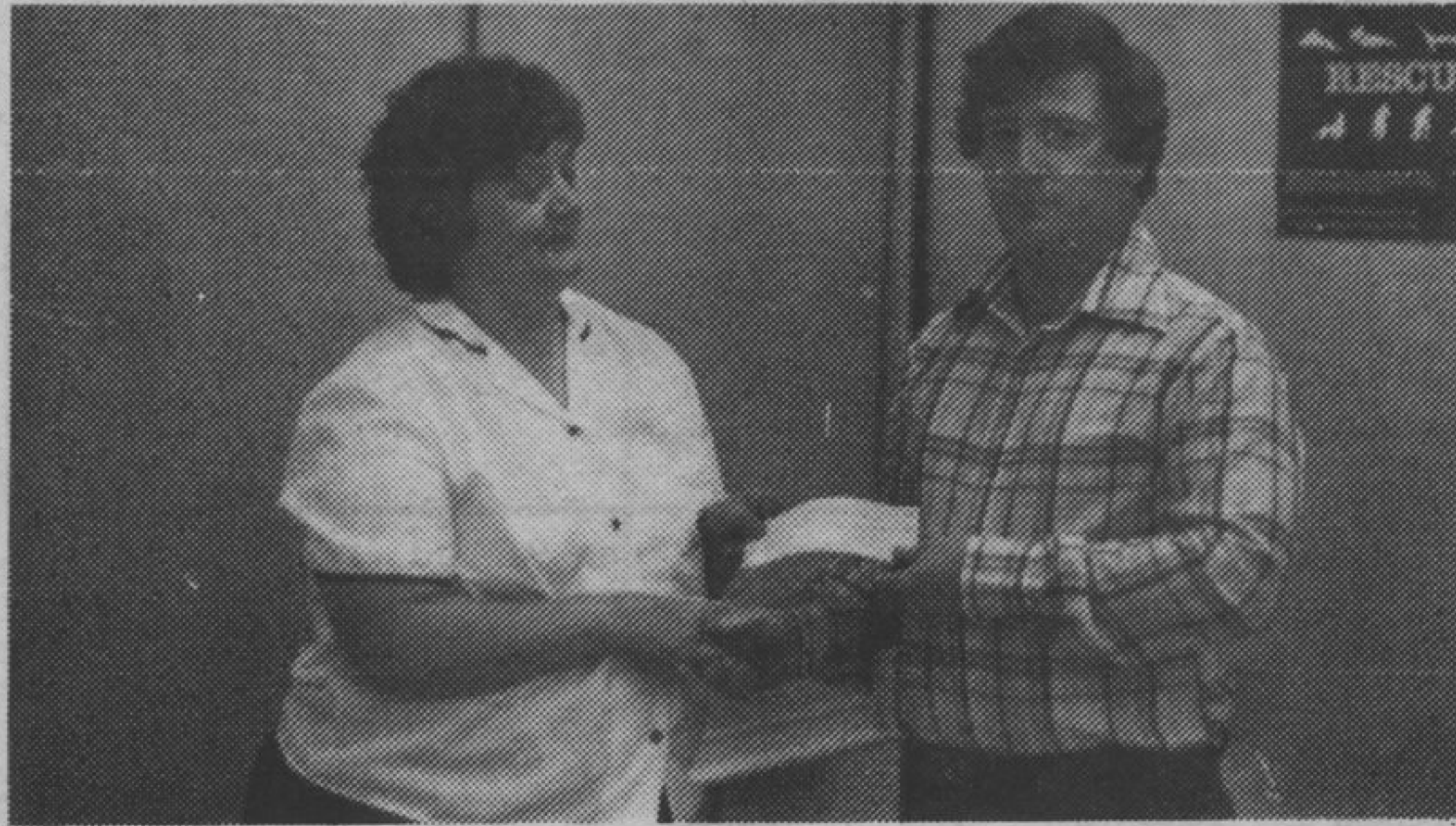


Kinsmen Presentation

"The Aging Veteran's Programme"

The Department of Veteran's Affairs have introduced a new programme aimed at helping veterans maintain and improve their quality of life and to enable them to live within their own communities and (if possible) their own homes.

The programme, known as the Aging Veteran's Programme, started in April 1981, and provides

financial assistance to qualifying veterans who need help in order to remain in their own homes or who need assistance in arranging for services from community facilities. To qualify to participate in this programme, individuals must be residents of Canada who were veterans and who were granted entitlement for a war related disability from the Canada Pension Commission.

Qualifying veterans, who are in need, will be provided with

financial assistance to cover costs related to home care and or community care services.

Home care services includes costs for professional health care, the preparation of meals, house-cleaning, ground keeping (including chores that are necessary and incidental to the maintenance of a home), care at day centres and home modifications to assist the handicapped. If care in community facilities are required,

the Dept. of Veterans Affairs will provide assistance in arranging for this care through existing nursing homes or other appropriate facilities.

Treating an Ethnic Disease

Two man-made amino acids first studied nearly a generation ago by Texas A&M scientists show promise as a treatment for Cooley's anemia — a hereditary blood disorder that affects people of Mediterranean ancestry. The compounds are called iron chelators and remove iron from the blood. In its more severe form, Cooley's anemia leads to death before age 21 because its victims are unable to transform iron into hemoglobin.
