Update on Water Polo

Youngsters who participate on the Terrace Bay Water Polo team were treated to two hours of instruction and evaluation by Shawn Laary of the Ontario Water Polo Association in Toronto. Also in attendance for the review were the Terrace Bay pool staff and Schreiber Director, Recreation Kevin Duguay.

The purpose of Shawn Laary's North Shore tour, was mainly to evaluate the team members and to follow-up on just what has been happening with the Regional Development Programme in water polo. Originally six of the North Shore towns were involved in the programme, but due to varying circumstances only two of those towns, Terrace

Bay and Marathon, have remained strong.

The pool staff have been certified in water polo instruction and their job will be to instruct and re-evaluate those team members who didn't pass muster during Shawn's visit.

The team members are now working on the bronze national water polo awards. This programme has been made possible by funding through the Ministry of Tourism and Recreation and is fully supported by both Recreation Committees.


