

Update on Water Polo

Youngsters who participate on the Terrace Bay Water Polo team were treated to two hours of instruction and evaluation by Shawn Laary of the Ontario Water Polo Association in Toronto. Also in attendance for the review were the Terrace Bay pool staff and Schreiber Recreation Director, Kevin Duguay.

The purpose of Shawn Laary's North Shore tour, was mainly to evaluate the team members and to follow-up on just what has been happening with the Regional Development Programme in water polo. Originally six of the North Shore towns were involved in the programme, but due to varying circumstances only two of those towns, Terrace

Bay and Marathon, have remained strong.

The pool staff have been certified in water polo instruction and their job will be to instruct and re-evaluate those team members who didn't pass muster during Shawn's visit.

The team members are now working on the bronze national water polo awards. This programme has been made possible by funding through the Ministry of Tourism and Recreation and is fully supported by both Recreation Committees.

The game of water

polo is not just a competitive team sport. Great emphasis is placed on 1) fun 2) fundamentals and 3) fitness.

An official water polo game, between Terrace Bay and Marathon was scheduled to take place in Terrace Bay last Sunday. An Awards Ceremony, plus a team get-together was also on the agenda. Due to our Friday deadline, results of this game were unobtainable. We'll keep you posted on their progress however.

The ideal marriage

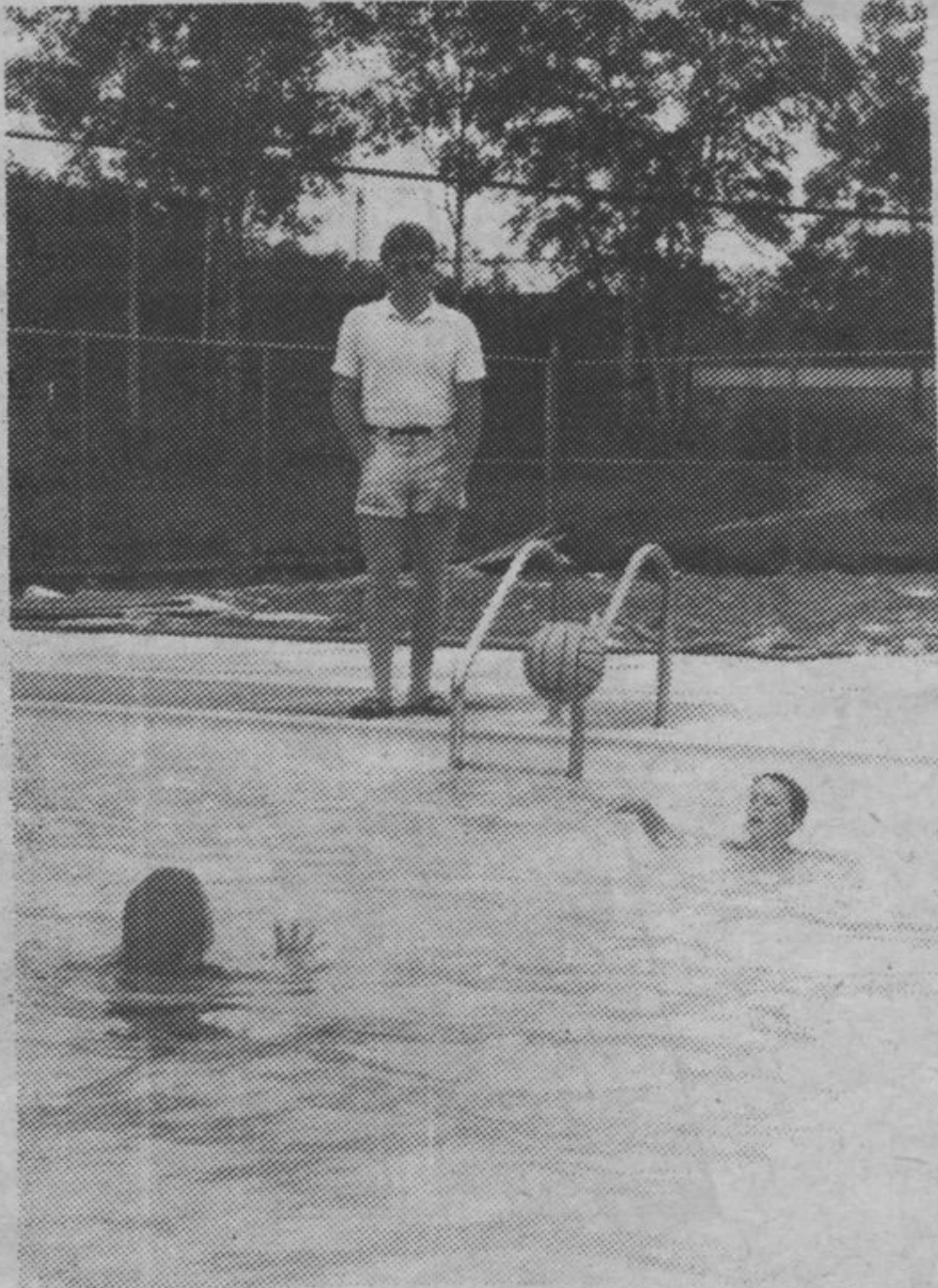
You have probably heard of an ideal couple who live the lives of Romeo and Juliet, a perfect couple united forever, for better or for worse...

You have probably crushed such a couple under your feet! Look closely at the multi-coloured crust covering this rock. It is a type of plant called a Lichen. The major characteristic of Lichens is that they are formed of a mushroom and a microscopic algae living in symbiosis is much like a perfect marriage where the two partners form an association that is both long living and benefi-

cial to both. In this very special couple, the algae produces the food necessary for the survival of the two partners while the mushroom anchors to the substrate and furnishes mineral and moisture for the algae.

This union permits the plant to survive in places that are inhospitable to other plants: bare rocks, tree trunks and even survive up to 60 weeks without a drop of water! The cost for the lichens is that they grow very slowly though their longevity is phenomenal. The Easter Islands statues have
