Summer Experience '83 - "Who is Where"

Summer Experience '83 is sponsored by the Secretariat for Social Development and administered by the Ontario Youth Secretariat. The programme offers 112 individual projects in 26 participating ministries of the Ontario Government, often in co-operation with community organizations.

The projects have been designed to complement the academic and career interests of young people. At the same time, young people are helping to provide valuable community services.

Ontario Youth Secretariat Information Officer, Dave Tamblyn spent an afternoon in Terrace Bay last week, visiting Summer Experience '83 participants who are currently in a sponsored programme in our area. "There are eleven participants in Terrace Bay, employed in the summer employment programme," says Tamblyn. The jobs range from guided tours at Neys Provincial Park to computer programming at Lake Superior High School. According to Tamblyn, "the jobs are geared towards complementing the individual's career goals while providing worthwhile services to the community."

In conjunction with the Ministry of Education and the province's school boards, Project 0801 is providing a wide variety of educational projects that are a direct benefit to the community. Student assistants are working with children with learning disabilities and tutoring in special subjects. The development of educational multi-media resource kits and many other types of educational proects are also being conlucted.

Participating in this particular programme is local youth by the name of Roger Wilson. loger is acclaimed as eing a "computer wiard" and has designd his own programmes n a "Pet" computer thich will supplement he English Grammar rogramme at Lake Suprior High School. All rogrammes can be exanded to accommodate creasing needs withthe system. If the ake Superior Board of ducation makes them ailable, programmes ill be adapted to suit a ommodor 64 compur. However, the Board is yet to make a final cision. Roger Wiln, who is 20 years old, entering his second ar in the Computer ience Programme at

the University of Waterloo.

Another project with Summer Experience '83 is being done in cooperation with the Ministry of Northern Affairs. Participants in this research oriented project are gaining practical knowledge from senior professionals about the functions of the Ministry of Northern Affairs in the areas of economic analysis and community development. Two students who are working with economists in the Community Development Branch of the Ministry of Northern Affairs are Renee DeGagne and Carman Millinila. Their area of study is the Hemlo gold field which lies 35 km east of the town of Marathon.

Front page speculation on the size and work force needed on the site, has brought many of the unemployed from across the country to the gates of the companies in the Hemlo area. Though Renee and Carman are not immediately concerned with the job seekers camped at the gates, they are seeking accommodation for the expected work force of 250. By compiling a community profile of services available in the towns surrounding the gold field, Carman and Renee are able to determine which municipality is best suited to take on the work force. Manitouwadge for example, is a prime candidate. It has had an official plan in place for many years and has recently completed a new sewage treatment and water filtration plant capable of tripling its capacity if neces-

Carman says "the main aim of the project is to co-ordinate a strategy between the mining companies and the municipalities so that long term planning may be successful." This would include such things as the total number of man hours expected at the site, suitable locations for tailings and support services network. Renee says, "we have to work fast to keep up with the rush."

Carman, 20, is in her second year in the Urban Studies programme at the University of Toronto and Renee De-Gagne, 20, is in her first year Economics at the University of Western Ontario.

The Ministry of Natural Resources is also playing an important role in this Summer Experience '83 programme. Young people are working in the Ministry's District offices doing a variety of manual, technical and

clerical work in the field of resource management.

Two youths who are employed with the M.N.R. for the summer are Elizabeth Brown and Anne Marie Sobocen, both working as Park Guides at Neys Provincial Park. The two girls put on a tour that you wouldn't want to miss out on. They organize trail tours for visitors to the park.

Prior to starting their actual work, Park Technician Steve O'Donnell instructed Liz and Anne on geology, plants, wildlife and the history of the area. When the two students are not out on the trail, they can usually be found meeting with the campers or hosting one of the many slide or movie presentations. Liz also shares her musical talent with the evening visitors to the park around the open campfire.

Elizabeth who is 20 years old, is in her second year of Social Science at the University of Western Ontario. Anne Marie Sobocen, who is 19 years of age, is in Outdoor Recreation at Lakehead University.

Four other young people are also employed at the M.N.R. District Office, doing various clerical, manual or technical duties, through the Summer Experience '83 program-


