Off-season use in Pukaskwa National Park



Fall has many advantages for the campers, hikers, and canoeists of Pukaskwa National Park. Not only are fall colours spectacular and cool lake breezes refreshing, but the park is quiet. Off-season use is low; few people are in the campgrounds or hik-

ing the trails and canoeing the lake. It is a peaceful place to enjoy a fall day. An additional bonus is that there are usually fewer biting insects, as well as people.

For those interested in viewing Pukaskwa National Park this fall and winter, here are a few things to note. The Kiosk and Visitor Centre close September 5. From September 5 to October 2, a self-registration system will be used in the campgrounds. There will be

no charge for day use. Backcountry users should register at the booth outside the Visitor Centre.

After October 2, camping will be free, but only minimal support facilities will be available. The campground road will not be plowed this winter, but Pukaskwa will be open to those interested in skiing, snowshoeing and winter camping.
