Waste Oil Furnaces

In an attempt to beat the rising costs of home heating and to conserve energy, many individuals are choosing non-traditional types of heating compounds for their homes.

A new type of heating practice that is appearing now is the use of the Waste-Oil Furnace. These furnaces are designed to operate on used oil, drained from

motor-vehicle crankcases. Considering the costs of conventional fuel in an oil furnace, the costs of utilizing a waste oil furnace appear to be a real bargain. Not so! A waste oil furnace may cause more problems than its worth.

As well as contravening legislation from the Energy Act, (administered by the Fuel Safety Branch of the

Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations) constituting an illegal action, the use of waste oil could cause lethal fires. When used as a fuel, waste oil is potentially dangerous, as it may contain high concentrations of gasoline or other highly flammable solvents! As well the use of waste oil is considered a threat to the environment as it is contaminated with heavy metals and chemical compounds.

No waste oil furnaces are approved for sale or use in Ontario. So if you are approached and offered a good deal in energy savings on a waste oil furnace, please remember it's not only illegal ... it's dangerous!

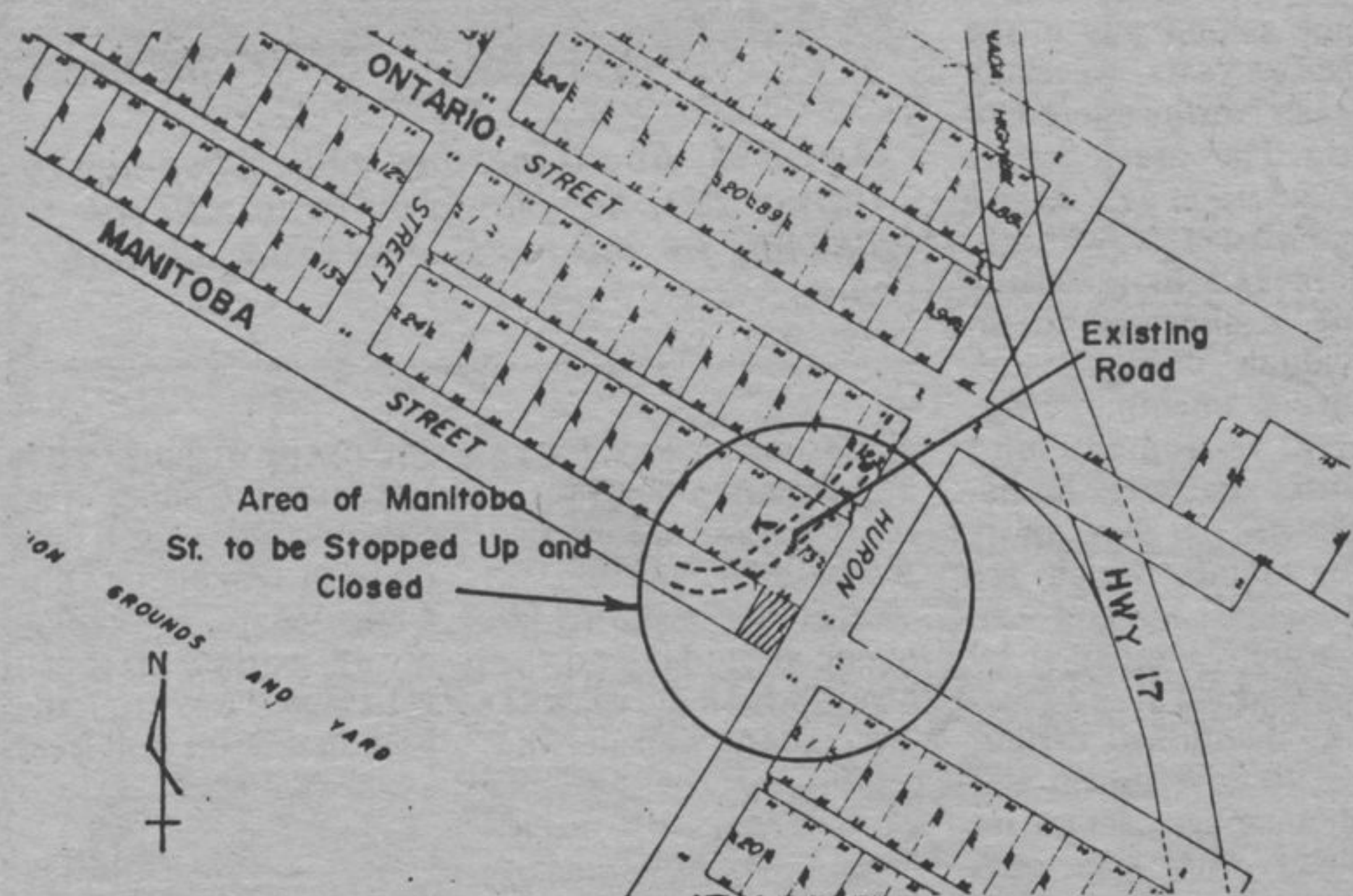
A By-Law to stop and close the public street of highway more particularly described as follows:
