Some of the major accomplishments are:

1) the number of

rheumatologists (specialists in the diagnosis and management of arthritis) has grown from four to more than 180.

2) Specialized care centres called Rheumatic Disease Units have been established at every

medical school and teaching hospital in the country.

3) Every medical student is now given an opportunity to work with arthritis patients and learn how to diagnose and treat the disease.
