Rossport Youth Saves Drowning Victim!

Thanks to the concern and quick thinking on the part of Andy Joiner, aged 14 of Rossport, Marie Geczy of Riverdale, New York will live for many more vears.

Andy Joiner was employed by Maria for the summer, to do odd chores around her Selim cottage. On August 26, 1983, Maria decided to take a stroll in the water in front of her lakeshore home. Maria had previously experienced problems with her knee, the result of a traffic accident from two years ago. While she was standing in waist-high water, her knee collapsed on her, causing her to go down. Three times she attempted to regain her standing position, without success.

"I would have drowned unless someone was there to assist me," stated Maria. "Thank God, Andy wasn't far away, and that he heard my feeble shouts for help.

Acting quickly and responsibly, Andy ran to the scene and lifted Ms. Geczy from the water and on to shore.

Upon discovering that much damage was done to her knee, the ambulance was summoned and Maria was then transported to the Mc-Causland Hospital. Two days later, she was then flown to Port Arthur General Hospital, as the damage was too extensive for the area hospital to deal with. Maria remained in Thunder Bay hospital for about one week and was then transferred back to Mc-Causland Hospital for two or three more days of recuperation. The surgery which was performed in Thunder Bay was only temporary. More extensive surgery must be done in the very near future.

With all the talk and accusations made about the typical teenagers of today, Ms. Geczy felt that Andy deserved recognition for his good deed.

Andy lives in Rossport with his family; his father employed as the lighthouse keeper of Battle Island for the past 13 years.

When asked how he felt about the whole episode, Andy replied that he felt good about him-

"Everyone is talking about me and about what I did. I don't think it was that special but

I'm glad that Mrs. Geczy is all right and that I played an important part in saving her life."

Congratultions Andy! It's nice to hear good things about our local youth.
