
Welcome Duane and Shirley Peters

On behalf of Terrace Bay, we at the "News" would like to welcome Duane and Shirley Peters into the area. Duane is taking over as the Lutheran Mission Developer and Vicar of the Lutheran Church here in Terrace Bay. The couple recently moved from the Fort Frances area where Duane served as the vicar in Ignace and Sioux Lookout. The Lutheran Mission, formerly under the direction of Rev. Richard Klein of Nipigon, was in need of a full time vicar, so when the invitation was extended to Duane, he expressed much interest. Lutheran Church work along the North Shore of Lake Super-

ior was carried out in the Schreiber area for a number of years through the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Nipigon and by various Pastors and congregations from the Thunder Bay area. Work in Marathon was done under the auspices of the now defunct Lutheran congregation in Manitouwadge. With the leaving of the full time Pastor in Manitouwadge and Rev. John Nelson from Nipigon, work was discontinued.

In 1981, the Immanuel Lutheran Church of Nipigon expressed the need for such a service again on the north shore and this was supported by the Pastors of the Ontario Circuit of the Minnesota North District.

The Rev. James Uhrinak and Rev. Klein of Nipigon toured the North Shore in the spring of '82 and upon their recommendation along with those of the

Board of Directors of the Minnesota North District, work on this began, with Terrace Bay used as the base. Services began in September of '82 at St. Martin Roman Catholic Secondary School auditorium by Rev. Klein and were later moved to the Chapel of Birchwood Terrace. In February of '82 the mission chose to be called the Holy Gospel Lutheran Mission.

Because more and more people are requiring this type of service, it was then decided that this area needed a full time Vicar. On September 25th, Rev. Klein gave his final sermon at Birchwood Terrace and introduced Vicar Peters and his wife to the community.

On October 18th, a Commissioning Service was held for Vicar Peters at the Holy Gospel Lutheran Mission in the Birchwood Chapel

with over a dozen Lutheran clergy and local clergy in attendance.

Duane and Shirley have quickly settled into Terrace Bay, and look forward to meeting the community. They seem very impressed with the communities of both Schreiber and Terrace Bay and look forward to enjoying all the recreational services that both towns have to offer.

Duane enjoys hunting, fishing (anything that involves the great outdoors) and also reading, while Shirley participates in a variety of hobbies ranging from downhill skiing to crafts and swimming. Shirley is a certified Lab Technician and has worked in such places as the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto and in Dublin,

Under the Act, consideration must now be given as to the acceptance of the assessment and whether approval to proceed with the undertaking should or should not be given and, if given, whether the approval should be subject to any conditions.

Before these matters are considered, any person may make a written submission with regard to the undertaking, the environmental assessment and the review thereof and may also require a hearing by the Environmental Assessment Board. The submission and/or hearing requirement should be sent by registered mail or delivered to me at the address below. A submission may be made in any form that clearly indicates the purpose of the document. The Regulation under the Act provides a form which may be used for a submission, but use of the form is not mandatory.

Any submission or requirement must be received by me no later than November 28, 1983. Any person who does not make a written submission which is received by me by that date will not have the right to require a hearing on the approval of the undertaking after the environmental assessment is accepted or amended and accepted.

Only those persons who make written submissions or require a hearing or otherwise advise me, will be placed on the mailing list for all subsequent notices or orders until a final decision on the undertaking is rendered.

Schreiber Council Report

The regular meeting of the Schreiber Township Council was held in the council chambers on October 11, 1983. All councillors and the Reeve were in attendance. The meeting was called to order by Reeve Fischer.

Minutes of the September 11th meeting were adopted as read. **Business Arising out of** the Minutes:

The Clerk reported that the Thunder Bay Housing Authority had acknowledged receipt of the request of the township of Schreiber for a "Need and Demand Survey" for the Senior Citizens apartments. The matter was referred to the Ontario Housing Corp. for act-

Delegations Mr. F. Harness addressed Council, requesting that they consider giving their support to the idea of celebrating the 100th anniversary of the naming of Schreiber in 1985. He related the fact that Schreiber has existed as a community since

1885, and recognition should be given to that fact. Schreiber has existed as a legal organized municipality since 1901, but the community was actually established with the advent of railway construction in 1885. A motion was passed that the township establish a committee to organize the celebration of the 100th anniversary with Councillor M. Cosgrove to be council representative and F. Harness and T. Quinton to be appointed from the township at large.

Water and Sewer Reeve Fischer recently met with W.C. Seitz of the Ministry of the Environment to discuss the operation of the new water treatment plant. After discussion by council the motion was made that the township request of the Ministry to operate the Water Treatment Plant, and to provide details of
