you can do a lot of those jobs around the house and yard a lot more easily if you take time ahead to organize and plan your work. The easily!

board is invaluable. It will permit you to hang tools and appliances where you can most conveniently find them and use them. A lightweight vise is also very handy for holding items in place while you are

If holding items is a problem, try wrapping the handles with cloth tape for a soft, secure grip. You can also dip the handles of your tools into a plastic coating liquid that is available from most hardware stores.

working on them.

When putting in nails or screws, try drilling a small hole first. They will go in much easier

and it will not affect the secureness of the hold. You can also dip nails and screws into glue before you put them in for additional firmness, but don't expect them to come out that

Many lightweight drills are available have bit holders which will accept different types of screws which eliminates the need to stress your wrist. If purchasing a new drill, try to find one that has both forward and reverse so that you can use it to remove screws as well.

Use "vise grip" pliers instead of regular ones. These units will clamp on to the object you're working on and will eliminate strain on the hands and fingers. They can also be used as a small, portable vise for smaller objects.

Remember, when lifting or moving heavy objects, let the big joints and muscles of your body do most of the work.

# NOTICE

Township Of Schreiber

## Re: Parking regulations to facilitate the removal of snow.

By Law 674, Section 3(14)

No person shall park or stand a vehicle on a highway or street in such a manner as to interfere with the movement of traffic or the clearing of snow.

By Law 662, Section V, 4(1)

No person shall park a vehicle on any street in the Township of Schreiber between the hours of 2:00 a.m. to 7:00 a.m. from and including the 15th of November in each year to and including the 15th day of April in each year.

By Law 662, Section V, 4(2)

Any By Law Enforcement Officer appointed for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this law, may cause any vehicle discovered in contravention, to be removed, taken to and placed, and stored, and all costs and charges be the responsibility of the owner.

By Law 739, Section V, 4(4)

3. That the owner or operator of a vehicle which was removed under Section of this By Law, may within 48 hours, exclusive of Sundays and holidays, after the time of the elapsed offence, report to the Municipal Office and pay to the Clerk-Treasurer the sum of \$35.00, or mail the ticket together with the sum of \$35.00 to the offices of the Clerk-Treasurer.

These By Laws will be stictly enforced.

Please govern yourself accordingly.
