Mail Service has improved

Michael Warren in a letter released to the Canada Post Corporation employees said that Canada Post has achieved 92 per cent 'on time' 1st class mail delivery performance during October - up 13 points since 1981. This he said is the highest service performance in over a decade, confirmed by independent tests con-

ducted by hundreds of our customers.

In his letter, Mr. Warren praised the performance of Canada Post employees. He said their work is being recognized by Canadians across Canada, and that a recent Decima Public Opinion Survey shows that 68 per cent of Canadians now rate their mail service as "good" to "very good". That's up from 51 per cent in 1981.

Local 'on time' performance for delivery of first class mail in the Mid-West Division exceeded the national performance level. Next day delivery within urban centres was 97.9 per cent in Winnipeg; 96.2 per cent in Saskatoon; 99.2 per cent in Regina and 98.8 per cent in Thunder Bay. The division average performance during October reach-

ed 98 per cent. Canada Post Corporation's current Service Performance Standards are 2 days for delivery of first class mail between urban centres across Canada and next day delivery within urban centres.



tal Health Programme has developed clinical services through six local offices in the district over the past year under the guidance of the Clinical Director, Dr. T.J. Turner. Mental health assessment and treatment are offered to children and adults ranging across a wide variety of problems from brief reactions to difficult situations to major psychiatric illness.

Early in the year, the Ministry of Community and Social Services requested that the Mental Health Programme assume sponsorship of the Community Development Programme. The Mental Health Board

appointed a task group to review possible organizational models and to propose a detailed plan to the Ministry. It was felt that the best approach to sponsorship was a total integration, the Mental Health Programme will continue its direct service role and the Community Development Programme will continue to develop programmes that are designed to prevent the buildup of stress and provide resources to groups and individuals to cope with the stress they do experience. No significant changes in roles of the workers of either programmes are anticipated.

Both Programmes are innovative and unique in the province. It is hoped that the melding of the two Programmes will provide the opportunity to develop a comprehensive approach to the mental health needs of the district and the enhancement of more cost-effective services.
