During the month of November, the Terrace Bay Fire Dept. held its regular training sessions.

A special meeting was held with Reeve Dave Speer, attending in regards to the Fire Dept. Social, snow removal in front of the Fire Hall, and an awning in front of the small walk at the door, due to the ice falling off the roof.

On November 14th, the Terrace Bay Fire Dept. was out going door to door handing out free Fire Prevention information. Please remember to read your pamphlet carefully. For those who did not receive any, please don't feel left out - the Fire Dept. is awaiting more bags to package the rest of the information, so we can get to the homes that were not reached.

In these pamphlets, there is a red heart symbol on a white background. This is made of fluorescent material and shines in the dark. This heart symbol is recognized Canada-wide, by all other Fire Departments. This symbol is to show that the heart placed on your window will support life in your bedroom or your children's room. In case of a rescue, that heart symbol could speed up the rescue operation.

Due to the popular demand of these hearts across Canada, the Fire Departments were only able to place one heart in each bag - a second order has been placed and the department will try to get more stickers for all occupied bedrooms and hand them out when they arrive.

The Fire Dept. answered two chimney fires; one house fire with minimum damage; two auto fires; and also assisted the Recreation Dept. on the failure of a compressor.

On November 16th, the Terrace Bay Cubs visited the Fire Hall.

To help the surviving relatives offset the cost relating to the funeral expenses of an eligible contributor, the Canada Pension Plan pays the contributor's estate a lump sum death benefit. To qualify the contributor must have made contributions to the Plan for the minimum qualifying period required by legislation. This period is either one third of the calendar year for which the person was required to contribute to the plan or for 10 calendar years, whichever is less. If the contributor does not meet the minimum qualifying period, their estate is not eligible to receive the death benefit.

It should be noted that this benefit is not paid automatically! The person responsible for the administration of the estate should make sure that a written application for this benefit is made as soon as possible following the death of a contributor.

Applications for this benefit can either be obtained by contacting your nearest Canada Pension Plan office or your local Northern Affairs Office located on the lower floor, Peninsula Building, 2 Gilbert Street, Marathon (229-1153) or Zenith 33160.
