In fact, some people forget the library for years until they find an old book stamped "Schreiber Public Library" in the corner of the closet. If you find one of these, please bring it back. We're having an amnesty until January 30, 1984. That means no fines, no dirty looks, no lectures. Bring them in and we'll say thank you.

The person you'll meet at the library desk is Billie Anne Saarienen. She is our regular librarian. Her job is to help you find books you might want, order films, sign books out and be one of your links with the library board. You'll find Mrs. Saarienen friendly and very helpful. If there's something you've been wanting to read, come in and see her or phone the library and she'll do her best to get it for you. The library is open Tuesday to Saturday between the hours of 2-5 p.m. Everyone is welcome. We've had some difficulty with people who deny having checked books out. 3) We're checking into the possibility of opening the library one evening a week. If regulations allow it, evening hours will probably be Tuesday. We'll keep you informed.

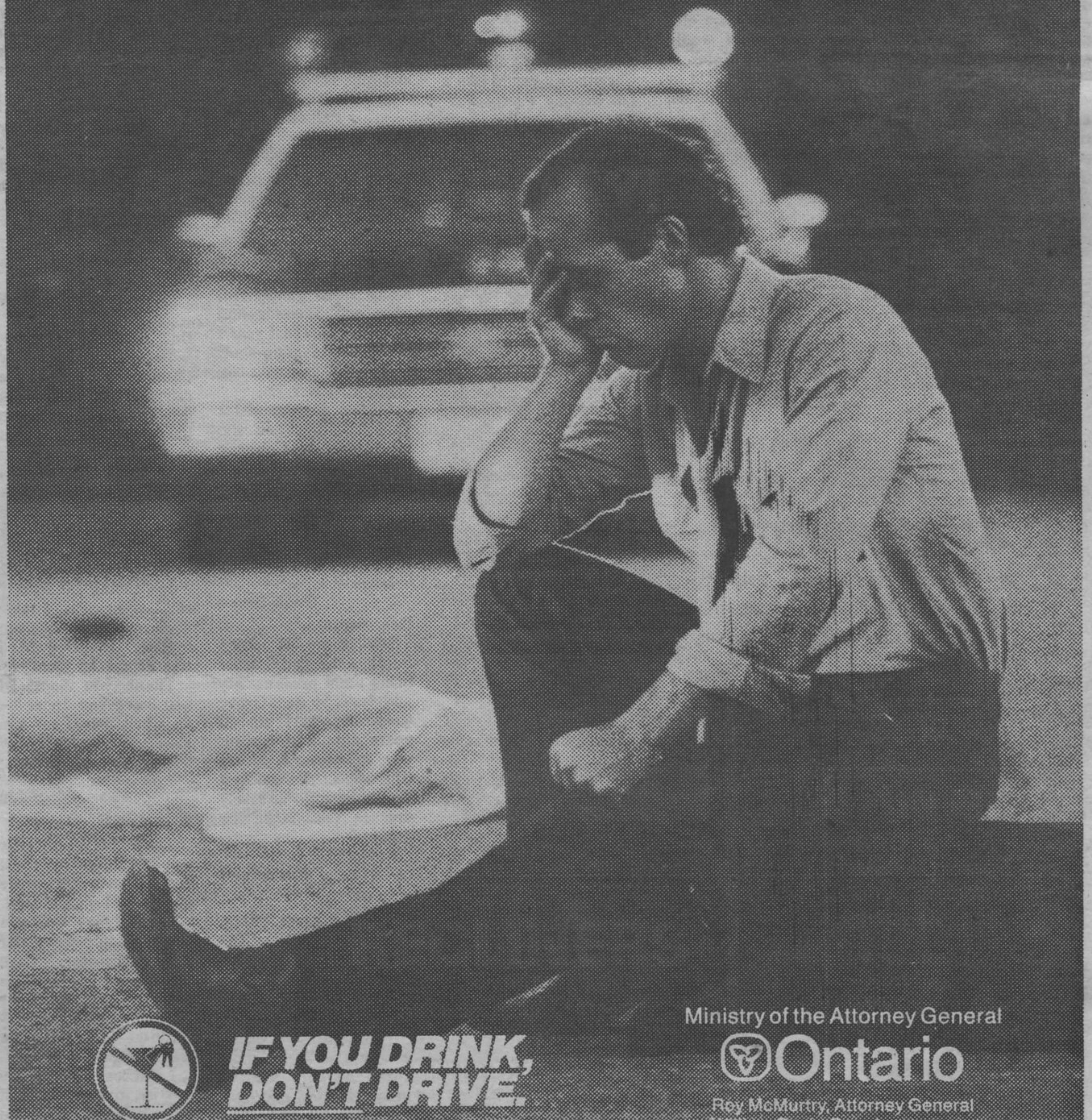
