Stress workshop planned

The Northwestern Ontario Women's Health Education Project will be holding a workshop entitled "Women and Stress: Coping with Northern Living." Rather than lecturing about stress, this workshop encourages women to get involved. It features an exercise called the "Ah-Web Chart". This is an opportunity for women to share their thoughts and experiences around northern living. Time will be provided for women to develop short and long-term solutions for stressors they have encountered.
