## TERRACE BAY HYDRO CUSTOMERS

The Council of the Township of Terrace Bay requests Ontario Hydro approval and will implement if approved, the following Schedule of Rates and Charges. This represents an average increase of 5.1% over existing rates for residential and 7.6% for commercial customers.

### Terrace Bay Hydro System SCHEDULE OF RATES AND CHARGES

#### Application

Application of rates and charges shall be in accordance with the Standard Application of Rates and amendments thereto as approved by Ontario Hydro. No rates and charges for supplying power or rates and charges to meet the costs of any work or service done or furnished for the purposes of a supply of power shall be made except as permitted by the Standard Application of Rates or as specified herein. Miscellaneous Charges, as approved, may be waived at the discretion of the supply authority.

#### Effective Engery

March 1, 1984 for all monthly bills issued on or after that date, and  
April 1, 1984 for all bi-monthly bills issued on or after that date.

#### Misc. Charges

March 1, 1984 for all charges incurred by customers on or after that date.

First 250 kw.h. at 7.56¢ per kw.h  
All additional kw.h at 4.24¢ per kw.h  
Minimum bill \$4.00

#### Street Lighting

\$14.62 per kilowatt of connected load

#### Miscellaneous Charges

Non-payment of Account  
Late payment - 5%

#### General Service (0-5000 kw)

Billing Demand  
First 50 kw No charge  
Balance kw at \$3.50 per kw  
Energy Charges  
First 250 kw.h at 7.56¢ per kw.h  
Next 12250 kw.h at 4.48¢ per kw.h  
All additional kw.h at 3.09¢ per kw.h

#### General Minimum Bill

under 50 kw of billing demand - \$4.00  
over 50 kw of billing demand - \$0.35  
per kw of maximum billing demand  
during the previous eleven months of  
contracted amount whichever is  
greater.

#### Transformer Allowance

Voltage between 1 and 50 kv - .35¢ per  
kw of billing demand

#### Transformer Losses

In accordance with Section IV, Clause 6  
of the SAR.
