continued from page 15 poor bookkeeping, it is hard to outdo the bureaucrats in one Ontario department and two municipalities.

The department mistakenly paid \$264,500 for a sewage project to the wrong municipality.

The municipality that should have received the money didn't complain. Nor did the municipality that received the windfall. And the govern-

ment department involved simply didn't understand there was an error, until the auditor pointed it out.

All this helps explain, perhaps, why we need independent government auditors, even if they are expen-

What we really require, though, are governments that will act on their advice.
