New Citizens Guide is available

The Student Venture Capital Programme is operated by the Ontario Youth Secretariat as part of the Ontario Government's Summer Experience Programme. This unique programme offers interest free term loans to eligible persons who intend to plan and operate their own small business. The maximum amount of the loan is \$2,000 and is interest free from April 2, 1984 to the repayment deadline of October 1, 1984.

To qualify for the Student Venture Capital Programme which will allow you to create, start and run your own summer business, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Applicants must be returning to a high school, college or university as full time students in the fall of 1984.

- Applicants must be 15 years old or over when the loan is issued.

- Applicants will only be considered for a loan if the business activity is carried out between Ap-

ril 2, 1984 and October 1, 1984.

- Applicants must be eligible to work in Canada and the business must be operated in Ontario.

- Applicants will be considered if they have participated in the programme in previous years and the loan was repaid on time.

Once received, applications should take at least 3-4 weeks to process and you must start your business activity within 2 weeks of receiving your loan.

Subject to the availability of funds applications will be accepted until June 5, 1984. If you are a student interested in starting your own business venture this summer, here's your opportunity!
