During the summer of 1984, as part of Ontario's Bicentennial Celebrations, Town Criers from municipalities across the province will be participating in Town Crier Festivals. The event, sponsored by Nordair in co-operation with the Ontario Bicentennial Advisory Commission and the Ontario Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, will feature criers proclaiming the history, physical features, of Bicentennial events of their home communities.

Municipalities may participate by appointing or selecting through a local festival, an official town crier and ensuring the crier is registered in the Regional Festival. Eight Regional Festivals will be held and Thunder Bay is included in those eight.

Three criers from each Regional Festival will be selected, on the basis of the included criteria, to take part in the Ontario Bicentennial Cry-off to be held in Ottawa on August 26th as part of the Heritage Village Programme at Super Ex. Nordair will provide air transportation and accommodations for these participants.

At the Cry-Off, prizes will be awarded for Best Overall Crier, Best Costume, Most Original Presentation, Best Scroll and Most Entertaining Presentation. For more information please contact Dorothy Gregory (Area Bicentennial Co-ordinator) toll free at 1-800-465-6912.

Town criers were essential to the daily life of our forebearers. They sang out the latest news at street corners and were sometimes referred to as "walking newspapers." Criers also announced the time of upcoming events and town meetings. With the rise of newspapers as a mass medium, town criers largely became obsolete until today.

The traditional town crier could be easily identified by his tricorne hat and hand bell. The uniform also included a shirt with lace cuffs and jabot (lace collar and fall) vest, waistcoat rimmed with buttons and braid, breeches and boots. Participants in the Bicentennial Town Crier Festival and Cry-Off are encouraged to develop a costume appropriate to the heritage and interests of their community.

Participants will be judged equally on the following:

- 1) Uniform - design;
- 2) Speech Contest - originality, Bicentennial Community and composition;
- 3) Presentation - general decorum, poise and delivery;
- 4) Voice - annunciation, quality and projection.

Each crier will perform for no more than two minutes. Cries may be in either English or French. There is no age limit to participants who may be either male or female. There will be at least five judges, including one representative from Nordair and one provincial Bicentennial Official. Others will be appointed regionally. Participants will be responsible for their own travel and accommodations at the Regional Festivals.

SEPTIC TANK SYSTEMS

Effective June 1, 1984, the inspection, certification, licensing and approval for use of all Private Sewage Disposal Systems as described in Part VII of the Environmental Protection Act, (privies, cess pits, leaching pits, holding tanks, septic tanks, hauled sewage systems, and the like), formerly under the jurisdiction of the Thunder Bay District Health Unit, will be undertaken by the Ministry of the Environment, Northwestern Region, Northwestern Regional Laboratory, 421 James Street South Thunder Bay, Ontario, P7E 2V6.

Information and Application Forms will soon be available from most municipal offices, Ministry of Natural Resources offices, or by contacting the Ministry of the Environment at 475-1275 in Thunder Bay. (Zenith 33220 in outlying areas).

All current Applications presently with the Thunder Bay District Health Unit will be automatically forwarded to the Ministry of the Environment.

Applications for septic tank systems made prior to June 1, 1983, and not constructed, must be resubmitted to the Ministry of the Environment.
