

# 100 Year Old RosSPORT Inn to Re-Open

For those many people seeking the ultimate in fine dining, you will be pleased to hear that the renowned RosSPORT Inn will be reopening its doors once again to the public during the upcoming week.

Ned Basher, the new owner of the 100 year old institution, is just adding his finishing touches. Since his purchase of the Inn just one year ago, Ned has completely renovated its interior. The building's original maple flooring has been restored back to its natural beauty, new plumbing, water, and septic systems have been installed, and the interior of both dining areas, the bar service area, the six hotel rooms, kitchen and lobby, now take on the flavour of the late 1800s.

Ned, being an avid antique collector, has tastefully displayed his vast array of heirlooms throughout his establishment. Brass beds and Hudson Bay blankets accent the upstairs rooms, rustic furniture graces the newly erected upstairs balcony (which offers his guests a breathtaking view of the RosSPORT harbour); various antiques and collectables including

lamps, candelabrum, clocks, furniture, and photographs can also be observed throughout the entire Inn.

Diners may opt for either dining room; one overlooking the harbour, the other, quiet and secluded, is suitable

for banquets or larger gatherings.

Ned, with the assistance of his manager, Colleen Kenney, are pleased with their hard work and look forward to catering to their many expected guests. Ned plans to keep the Inn open for six months out of the year - May through December. The Inn will employ a staff of eight to ten people, with Ned as one of the chefs. It will open at 8:00 a.m. for breakfasts, and will remain open until 11:00 p.m.

Specialties of the house will include a daily fish chowder, fresh lake trout and whitefish, chicken, steak and lobster. Ned believes in man-sized meals, so be

prepared for a 'feast fit for a king.' "A lot of time and hard work has gone into

the restoration of this Inn," said Ned Basher, "but it has finally all come together for us."

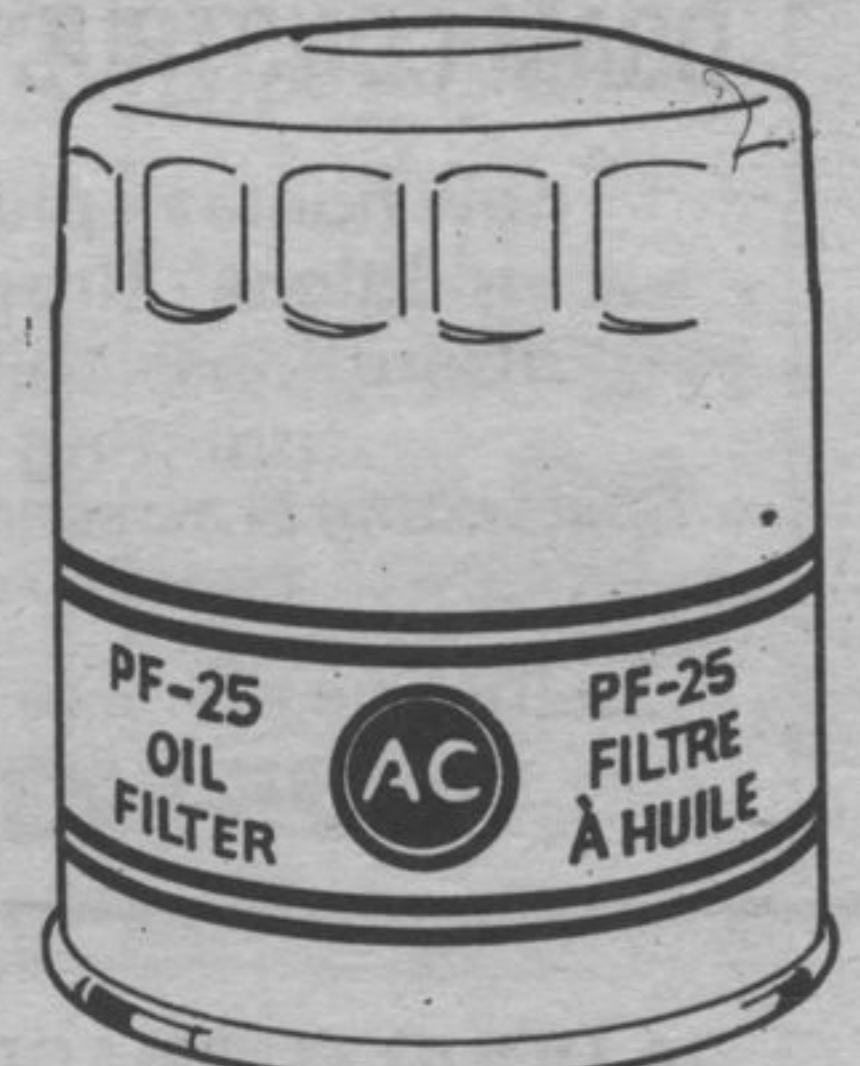

## PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSIONS ON MOBILE PCB DESTRUCTION REGULATORY PROPOSALS

The Ontario Ministry of the Environment plans to introduce proposals to regulate the operation and siting of mobile polychlorinated biphenyl (PCB) destruction facilities.

PCBs are a class of synthetic organic chemicals that do not decompose easily and which accumulate in living organisms. There is a growing inventory of wastes in storage because there are no currently approved destruction facilities in Canada. Mobile destruction facilities may be brought to those Ontario communities where the bulk of PCB wastes are awaiting disposal. The proposals for regulation of these facilities will be submitted to a public hearing under the Public Inquiries Act. Prior to the hearing, the Ministry is inviting public comment on the proposals. Information will be made available in a series of public information sessions to be held in the 18 communities in Ontario where approvals for the use of such facilities is most likely to be requested.

The regulatory proposals set out the requirements under which mobile PCB destruction facilities will be permitted to locate and operate in communities in Ontario. The public's views are invited.
