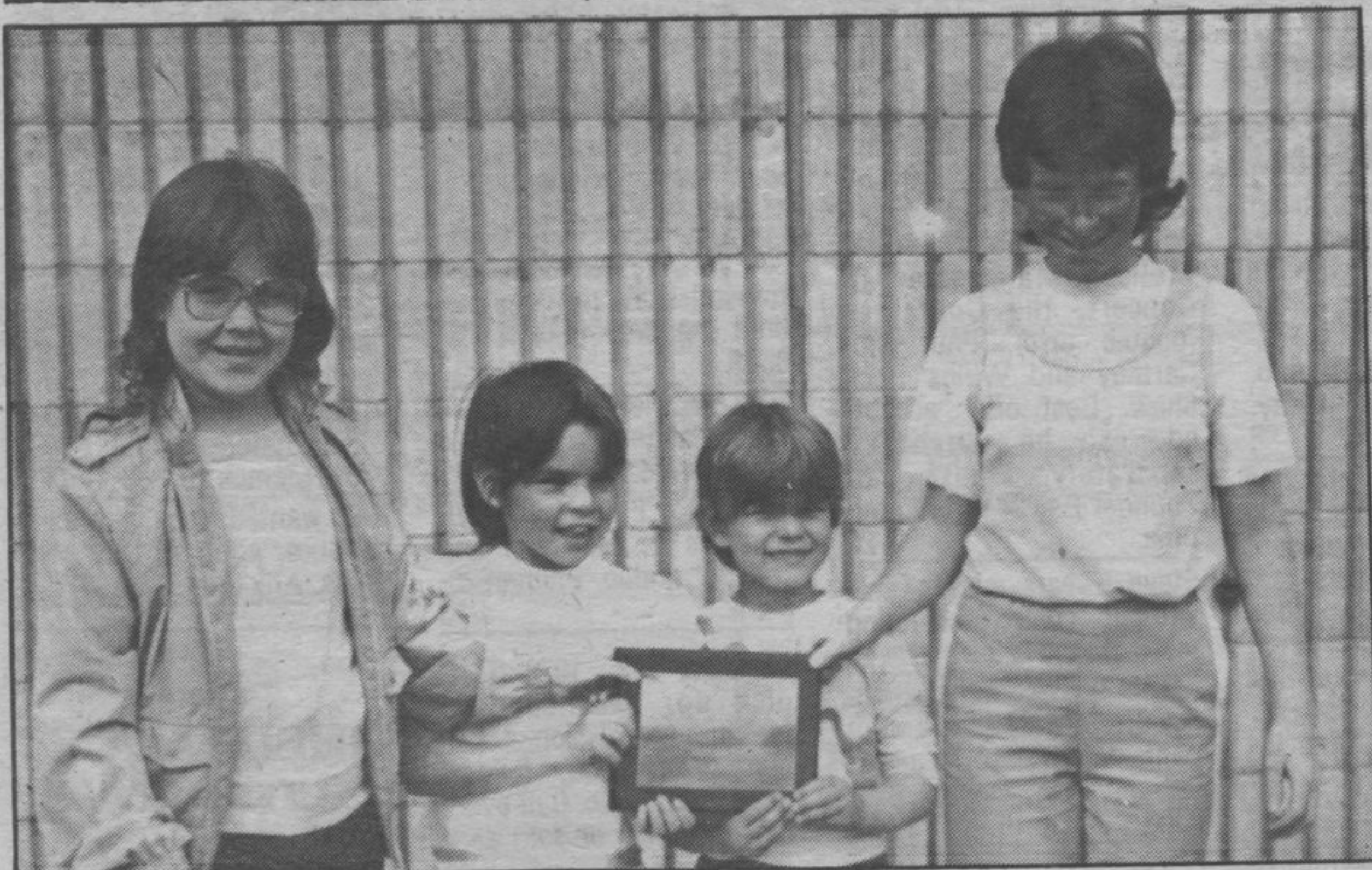


Fun - Run Challenge Winners

Quintuplets Anniversary



Dionne Quintuplets

On May 28, 1934, something very special happened in a farmhouse near Corbeil, Ontario, just outside of North Bay. Five tiny baby girls were born. Their names were Annette, Cecile, Yvonne, Emilie and Marie, and they became known as the world-famous Dionne Quintuplets.

The parents of the five little girls were Elzire and Oliva Dionne and on May 28, 1984, we remember the birth of these identical sisters. Two of the Quints, Emilie and Marie are now dead, but the other three sisters all live near Montreal, in the suburb of Saint Bruno-de-Montarville. Their

father Oliva died in 1979 but the rest of the Dionne family still live in the North Bay area.

To help celebrate the Quint's 50th birthday, a variety of events will be held in North Bay this summer. If you plan on being in the area, visiting or camping during the summer, please try to take in at least one of these special festivities.

Visit the North Bay and Area Museum which has an exhibition of original photographs and reproductions of postcards from the collection of Robert Atkinson of Toronto, the Unicorn Theatre will be presenting a play about the Quints' story during 2 weekends in late Aug-

ust; the original Dionne Homestead, where the Quints were born, will once again be open for visitors on the grounds of the Pinewood Park Motor Inn; and future plans for this special building include the City of North Bay purchasing the 100 year old log and clapboard cabin with the assistance of the people of North Bay and the Province of Ontario.

The North Bay and District Chamber of Commerce has arranged the striking of coins, legal tender in North Bay, in order to recognize the occasion.

Notice Re Proposed Amendment

Kimberly-Clark of Canada Forest Operating Plan (1981-86)

All interested parties are invited to comment on a Proposed Amendment to the Kimberly-Clark of Canada Forest Operating Plan (1981-86).

Kimberly-Clark of Canada Limited proposes to harvest timber in an area approximately thirty (30) kilometers south of Longlac for their mill in Terrace Bay. As a result of Kimberly-Clark adapting their No. 1 mill in Terrace Bay to utilize poplar, additional operating areas outside of their approved operating plan are proposed as an amendment.

This proposed amendment will be available for Public Review at the district office of the Ministry of Natural Resources, 208 Beamish Avenue West, Geraldton, Ontario.
