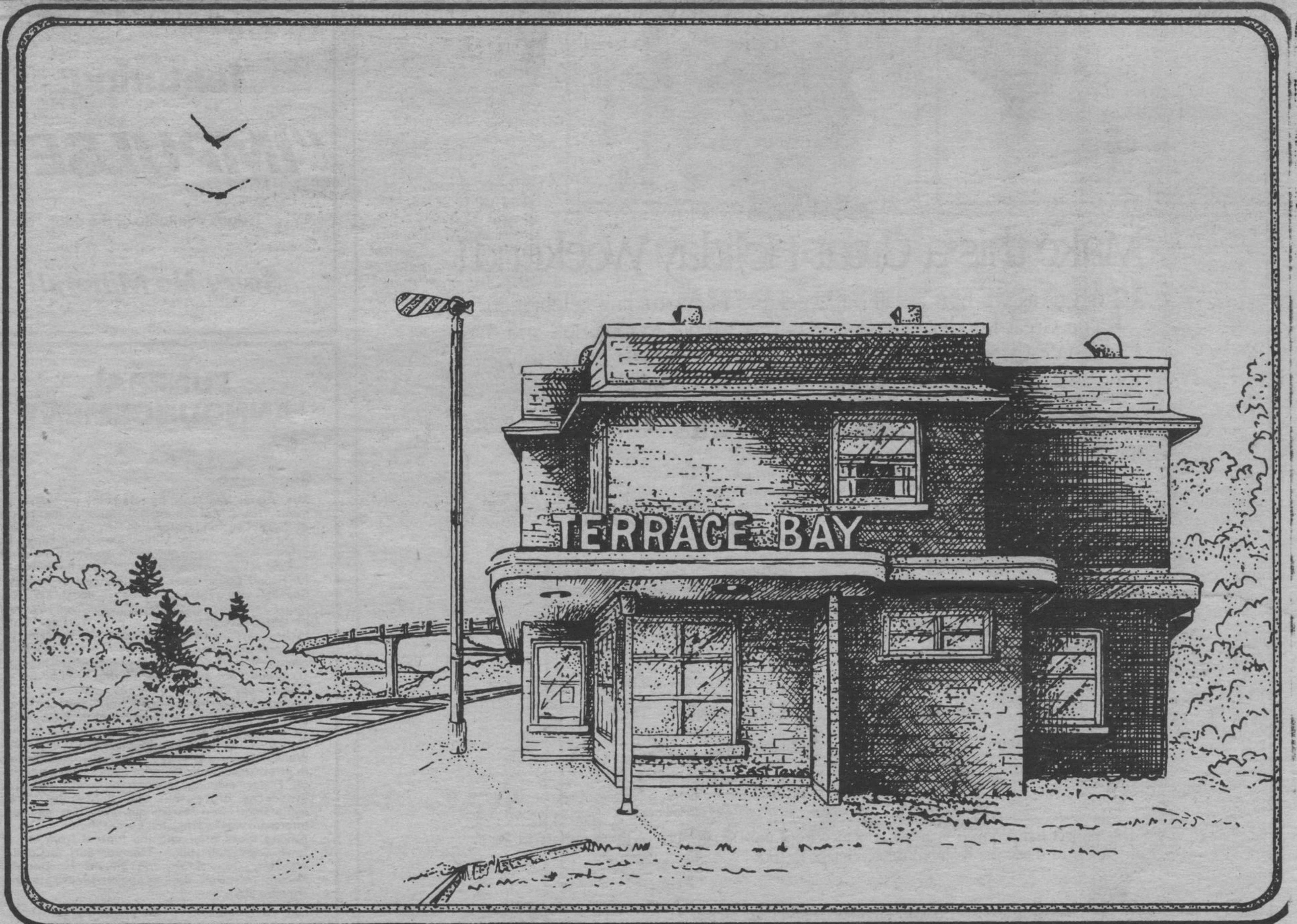
Rev. LeGrand is familiar to many in the area,
