Bob Cheetham, a thirty-four year old municipal police officer for the past six and one-half years, is the husband of Marathon native, Susan

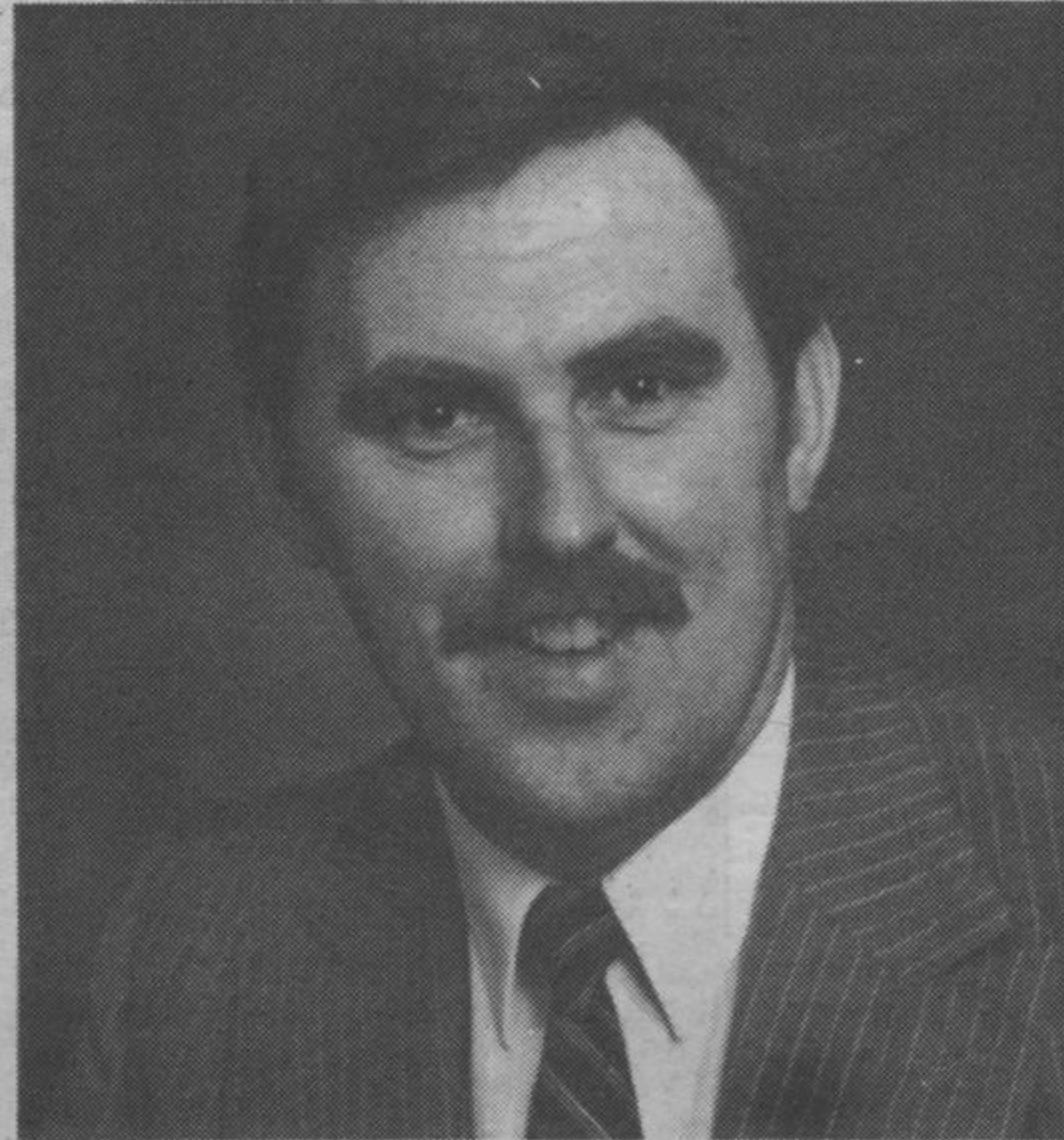
McNeil, and parent of two children, Christopher, thirteen and Jennifer, nine years of age.

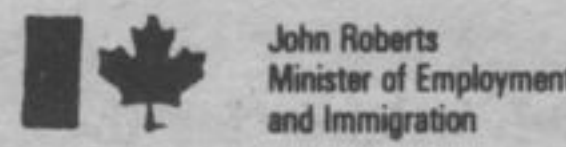

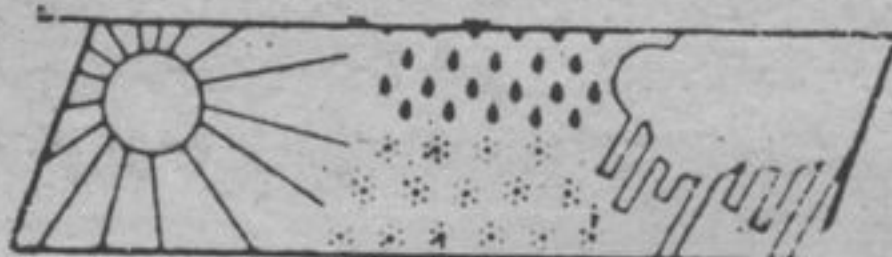
