Resolution 84-91: Moved by E. Borutski, and W. Hiller: That T. Quinton, be appointed to act as Council representative to the Mc-Cuasland Hospital -Rossport - Terrace Bay -Schreiber Foundation, at the pleasure of Council. CARRIED.

Letters from M.M. Dillon, Consulting Engineers, and the Ministry of Northern Affairs, confirmed that they would gladly contribute to the cost of a bronze plaque, commemorating the opening of the Schreiber Water

Treatment Plant. Resolution 84-92: moved by E. Borutski and W. Hiller: That the Township of Schreiber proceed with the purchase of a bronze plaque, to commemorate the official opening of the Water Treatment Plant, the cost not to \$1200. exceed CARRIED.

A resolution and Letter from the Town of Leamington, requested support of their resolution concerning energy conservation. The resolution requests the Federal Government to insure that the full benefit of energy conservation programs be made available to the entity initiating the savings, and that further increases in all types of energy be curtailed, so that the

consumer may benefit. Resolution 84-93: moved by T. Quinton and E. Borutski: that the Township of Schreiber support a Resolution of the Town of Leamington, regarding the conservation of energy. CARRIED.

Confirmation has been received from the Ministry of the Environment that the upgrading of service connections and watermains on Alberta St. has been approved to the extent of \$25,750.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Terrace Bay passed By-law Number 11-84 on the twenty-fifth day of June, 1984, under Section 34 of the Planning. Act, 1983.

AND TAKE NOTICE that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the by-law by filing with the Clerk of the Corporation of the Township of Terrace Bay no later than the seventh day of August, 1984, a notice of appeal setting out the objection to the by-law and the reasons in support of the objection. An explanation of the purpose and effect of the by-law, describing the lands to which the by-law applies, (or alternatively, an explantaion as to why a key map is not provided) follows. The complete by-law is available for inspection in my office during regular hours.

> By-law number 11-84 applies to a roughly triangular area bordered by Mill Road, Cemetery Road, and the Kimberly-Clark rail spur line. The by-law changes the zoning on this land from Rural (A) to General Industrial (M). This change will allow the proposed development of a wholesale industrial supply business on this property.

A key map of this area cannot conveniently be reproduced for publication.
