You should also insist on having starting and completion dates and the responsibilty the contractor takes for workmanship included in the contract. In addition, you should look for any blank spaces in the contract. Mark them N/A (non applicable) or

Buyer Protection

Under the Business Practices Act no company is allowed to engage in unfair business practices by making false, misleading or deceptive claims. If you feel the contractor made clear misrepresentation, you may send a letter cancelling the agreement. If this doesn't bring satisfaction, you may take the contractor to court under the act.

Under the Consumer Protection Act you may cancel a contract made with an itinerant (doorto-door) seller within two working days of receiving your copy of it. You may cancel by sending a registered letter to the company or by delivering it personally to continued on page 5

Native Language Education for '86

Native students will be able to study their own language, the Education Minister, Dr. Bette Stephenson announced last week.

Dr. Stephenson said that Native as a Second Language Program will be implemented in the schools by September of 1986.

The new policy will legitimize the status and function of Native languages within the school systems and incorporate the teaching of Native languages into the regular school day at the secondary school level, she said.

Dr. Stephenson said

that for some time the Native people have been concerned that their young people can no longer speak or under stand their mother ton gue and requested tha schools attended by their children offer Na tive languages as a sub ject of instruction.

As part of the pro gram the Ministry wil prepare a new curricu lum guideline for the teaching of Native lan guages, increase the number of qualifed Na tive language instruct ors and offer addi tional grants to schoo boards that provide Na tive language instruct ional programs.


