

The Fun Day will begin at 12:00 noon at the High School Field (in case of rain in the Arena) with a Barbecue Lunch and continue into the afternoon with


Parent/child races, apple bobbing, pinatas and many more fun filled events. Ages for this event are 3 to 12 years. Hope to see you there!


