

Annual Recruitment Tour Planned

The Ministries of Northern Affairs and Health are gearing up for the Annual Recruitment tour, a program designed to attract health professionals to underserved areas.

Dr. Bill Copeman, manager of Health's underserved area program, said "We have 20 communities to date that have indicated their participation in this year's tour." He added he was confident the number of

communities taking part in the 1984 tour would probably equal last year's figures, but he was concerned that so many communities leave their planning to the last minute.

This year's five day tour will run from Monday, October 22 to Friday, October 26 with visits to the communities of Ottawa, Kingston, London, Hamilton and Toronto, respectively.

Northern Affairs Minister Leo Bernier, a strong advocate of the annual tour, said, "This is one event that medically underserved communities can't afford to miss. It provides a forum for them to promote their communities and meet well over 1,000 health professionals looking for employment now and in the future. Travel grants are provided to participating communities to help them defray the costs of

the five day tour.

"In an effort to help northern communities organize for the tour, my ministry has produced an audio/visual tape which I feel is a definite asset in pre-tour planning." Communities wishing to view the presentation should contact their nearest Northern Affairs Officer.

"Letters outlining this year's tour have gone out to all Chief Municipal Officers of communities in Northern

Ontario, Administrators and Chiefs of Staff of hospitals, physicians practising in underserved areas, District Health Councils and Area Planning Coordinators and the Ontario Medical Association," said Dr. Copeman. "We're accepting communities on a first come first served basis."

The Ministry of Health has to make advanced reservation for transportation, recep-

tion rooms and food. "A well thought out and planned display, in the company of qualified community representatives, is the first big step towards success on the tour," said Mr. Bernier. "And I urge underserved Northern communities to act now."

The McCausland Hospital of Terrace Bay with financial assistance from the Township of Terrace Bay will be participating as well as the Township of Schreiber.

Next meeting is scheduled for Birchwood Terrace July 27, 1984.

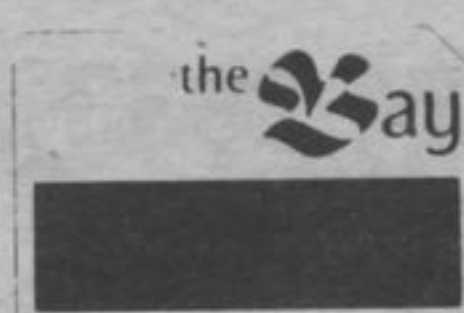
