Desjardins' solution to the transportation cost problem is the acquisition of the Canadian National Rail Line between Cochrane and Nakina by the Provincial Government and

operating by the Ontario

Northland Railway.

"I will actively seek the transfer of the Rail Line from the Federal

Crown Agency which obviously isn't interested in the development of our region to a Provincial Agency whose mandate is one of a development road", stated Desjardins. "Such an Inter-


Government transfer will be enhanced many fold with two Progressive Conservative Governments carrying out negotiations", said the Federal hopeful.


